These transfer listings are primarily based on academic catalogs since Fall 2005. Therefore, please understand that these listings are a culmination of TROY courses and transfer courses as of this current date. It is not necessarily a complete listing of all possible transfer courses from any one institution, although, the most common transfer institutions for TROY will display more extensive course listings. As requirements and course descriptions may change, this transferability information is subject to change at any time, without prior notification.

Students, advisors, and/or faculty/staff may all use these transfer pages to understand how course work from the listed institutions will be applied as TROY course work.

Students eligible for Servicemembers Opportunity Colleges (SOC) programs or other articulation agreements may not always see those courses as listed on those specific agreements. Therefore, they should not use these transfer pages alone to determine the potential transfer credit award. The SOC transferability tables or actual transfer/articulation agreements should be used as they will take priority in the official transfer credit evaluation, with the exception of courses ineligible for transfer due to specialized accreditation rules/regulations that may apply specific majors.
