

Graduate Nursing Scholarship

Established in 2016, the Graduate Nursing Scholarship is awarded to graduate students enrolled in the nursing program.

Jessica M. Lewis Scholarship

Established in 2003, the Jessica M. Lewis Scholarship is awarded to Troy University students who are graduates of O'Connor High School in Bexar County, Texas, or female dependents of an active-duty Air Force Chaplain.

Bryan Bergob Memorial Scholarship for Sigma Alpha Epsilon

The Bryan Bergob Memorial Scholarship for Sigma Alpha Epsilon was established in 1999 by Tom and Teresa Bergob to assist a Sigma Alpha Epsilon member with books and associated fees. Recipients must be classified as sophomores, juniors, or seniors and have a GPA between 2.0 and 2.9.

SE Chapter of Alabama Society of CPA'S Scholarship

The Southeast Chapter of the Alabama Society of CPA's Scholarship was established in 2006 to assist outstanding accounting students on Troy's Dothan Campus. This scholarship is awarded based on the applicants' accounting profession activities, University life, and community volunteer work. Recipients must have and maintain a minimum 3.5 GPA. The Dothan Campus School of Accounting selects recipients.



Phenix City Campus Academic Merit Scholarship

The Phenix City Campus Academic Merit Scholarship was established in 2017 to provide funding to students pursuing undergraduate degrees at Troy University's Phenix City Campus. To be eligible for this scholarship, students must be self-supporting single parents, have demonstrated financial need, and have completed twelve hours of undergraduate work at the Phenix City campus. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. The Phenix City Scholarship Committee selects recipients.

Barber Dairies Scholarship

Established in 1991, the Barber Dairies Scholarship is awarded to junior or senior students majoring in business. To be eligible for this scholarship, students must be residents of Alabama, plan on pursuing a career in business after graduation, and showcase entrepreneurship, campus leadership, academic achievement, and financial need. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Applicants are required to submit a short essay on the meaning of the free enterprise system, a financial information form, and a resume.

Bill Buchannon Memorial Scholarship

The Bill Buchannon Memorial Scholarship was established by Jeanette Buchannon in 1989 in loving memory of her late husband. The awarding of this scholarship is rotated annually, first to senior students majoring in journalism or public relations and then to senior band students. A committee comprised of the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, the Chair of the Journalism Department, and Development staff selects recipients.



KDP Rho Phi Annual Scholarship

The KDP Rho Phi Annual Scholarship was established in 2009 to benefit graduate students who are members of the Rho Phi Chapter of Kappa Delta Phi at Troy's Phenix City Campus. Applicants are required to submit at least one recommendation letter from a teacher and a strong record of community service. The Troy University Scholarship Committee selects recipients.

Phenix City Rotary Club Scholarship

The Phenix City Rotary Club Scholarship was established in 2014 and is awarded to transfer students who completed their studies at Chattahoochee Valley Community College and achieved at least a 3.0 GPA. Preference is given to students who are pursuing an undergraduate degree in education, who participated in the CVCC Elementary School Reading Project, or were members of the Interact Club in high school. The Phenix City Scholarship Committee selects recipients.

Louis R. Wadowick Scholarship

In 1978, James and Martha Wadowick established the Louis R. Wadowick Scholarship in tribute to Louis. This scholarship is awarded to talented trumpet or French horn majors with the highest character. To be eligible for this award, first-time students must have an overall B average in high school, while all other recipients must have an overall last semester GPA of 1.5 or satisfactory academic performance as determined by the scholarship board.



Sanders Environmental Scholarship

Sanders Lead Company was founded in 1968 and has been an integral part of the Troy, Alabama community ever since. In 1990, Sanders brought their impact to Troy University students by establishing the Sanders Environmental Scholarship. This is a full-tuition scholarship awarded to hard-working students majoring in environmental science, with preference given to students who reside in Pike County, Alabama. Recipients must possess the highest character, have financial needs, and maintain a 2.5 GPA. To qualify for the award, first-time students must demonstrate satisfactory academic work, recommendations, extracurricular activities, and a strong interest in environmental science. Current Troy students must have a strong academic record, discipline, and a recommendation of pertinent faculty. Recipients are selected by the Development Office in conjunction with the Sanders Scholarship Committee.

Jess Jordan Scholarship

In 1977, the Troy Broadcasting Corporation established the Jess Jordan Scholarship to keep the memory of a beloved Troy citizen alive, help elevate journalism training, and lead Alabamians to better understand their community. This scholarship is awarded to students pursuing a major or minor course of study in the Hall School of Journalism. Recipients must be freshmen, sophomores, or juniors planning a journalism career. Students can contact the Hall School of Journalism for more information on applying.



Chancellor's Fellowship

The Chancellor's Fellowships are awarded to senior or graduate students attending classes on Troy University's main campus who have a 3.0 GPA and strong leadership ability. Recipients are required to work up to ten hours per week with a faculty or staff member in an area relating to their major. Recipients cannot be on any other Troy University work program. Applicants must submit a letter of recommendation from a Troy faculty member. Ten scholarships, two per college, are awarded annually. The deans of each college select the two recipients.

Alpha Phi Sigma Honor Grad Scholarship

The Alpha Phi Sigma Honor Graduate Scholarship is awarded to graduating senior members of Troy University's Alpha Phi Sigma. Selection is based on the student's GPA, positive attitude, participation in program activities, University life, and volunteer activities.

Sigma Chi Alumni Scholarship

Established in 1997, the Sigma Chi Alumni Scholarship is awarded to the brother with the highest-grade point average in the fall pledge class. Recipients must be full-time students and members of the Eta Phi Chapter of Sigma Chi. The undergraduate brothers of Sigma Chi select recipients to receive the annual \$1,000.00 award.



McPherson-Mitchell Lecture Series in Southern History

The McPherson-Mitchell Lecture Series in Southern History is an annual event in which various lecturers are chosen to present an address to an audience of faculty and staff of the History Department, history majors, and other interested individuals. Lecturers are selected from various historical perspectives in Southern history with scholarly publications by a major academic press. Lecturers must be able to present their scholarship orally to a general undergraduate audience in a lively and engaging way that is likely to evoke or provoke an audience response. After the lecture, a reception is held to honor the lecturer.

Leola Sanders Alexander Scholarship

The Leola Sanders Alexander Scholarship was established in 1998 in memory of Mrs. Leola, a Troy State graduate and educator. Recipients of this scholarship must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA.

Anne Wood Johnson Scholarship

The Central Alabama Community Foundation established the Anne Wood Johnson Scholarship in 2002 to assist students attending Troy University full-time.



Norma Taylor Mitchell U.S. History Award

Dr. Norma Taylor Mitchell was a committed feminist who spent the entirety of her professional career researching the lives and histories of women and African Americans. She was the first female history faculty member at Troy State University to achieve the rank of associate professor in 1970, and she was tenured in 1977 and promoted to full professor in 1984. As a devoted professor, Dr. Mitchell brought new scholarly perspectives to Troy students and introduced several permanent courses. In 1999, Dr. Mitchell retired from the University, and the Norma Taylor Mitchell U.S. History Award was established in her honor. This award is presented annually to the student who is judged to be the outstanding student in the fall semester of United States History general studies classes. Selection is made by faculty members of the History and Philosophy Department. The recipient is announced and presented with the award at the Honors Convocation.

Choral Scholarships

Choral Scholarships, such as the Bob Ell Rhodes Graves Scholarship, are awarded to female Choral students from Alabama.

Marshall A. McLeod Geomatic Scholarship

The Marshall A. McLeod Geomatic Scholarship, established in 2007 by Lynda Burkett, is awarded to female students majoring in geomatics who have financial need. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Eligible students must submit a scholarship application provided by Marshal A. McLeod, PLS, LLC. The Geomatics Scholarship Committee selects recipients.



Heather Alsbrooks Scholarship

Heather Lynn Alsbrooks was a student at Troy University when she passed suddenly at the age of twenty-one. In 2002, Lynann Henagan established the Heather Alsbrooks Scholarship in her daughter's memory. This scholarship is awarded to junior music education majors with a 3.0 GPA. Band staff selects recipients.

Department of Art and Design Study Abroad Current Scholarship

In 2009, the Art & Design Department faculty came together to establish the Department of Art and Design Study Abroad Current Year Scholarship to assist outstanding and deserving TROY students. This scholarship is awarded to art and design students traveling outside the United States in the Study Abroad Program. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. The amount awarded is dependent upon available funding and the number of applicants. This award is to be used toward tuition not covered by financial aid; any money exceeding tuition can be directed towards the expenses of the study abroad program. Students can contact the Department of Art and Design for more information on applying.

Earl and Carol Franks Scholarship

Former Troy University professor Carol J. Franks and her husband Earl established the Earl and Carol Franks Scholarship in 2009 to assist students from Luverne High School in Luverne, Alabama. This one-time scholarship is awarded annually to two female and one male students. Recipients must possess a strong work ethic, selfless dedication, good attitude, and integrity.



Dept. of Kinesiology and Health Promotions Annual Scholarship

Originally established in 2009, the Department of Kinesiology and Health Promotions Annual Scholarship is awarded to junior or senior students enrolled in any academic major within the Kinesiology and Health Promotions program. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA, possess a strong work ethic, and be active within the department. Faculty members in the Department of Kinesiology and Health Promotions select recipients.

Jim Stephens Scholarship

The Jim Stephens Scholarship was established in 2009 by long-time Troy University supporter James "Jim" Stephens. This scholarship is awarded to incoming freshmen students based on the following guidelines: (1) Achieved a GPA of at least 3.0 and scored at least a 19 on the ACT. (2) Eligible for the Pell Grant. (3) Enrolled full-time at TROY. (4) A resident of Alabama. Recipients are required to participate in a work-study assignment and are expected to successfully complete all coursework attempted. The Troy University Scholarship Committee and Associate Vice Chancellor of Financial Aid select recipients.

John T. White and Lambda Chi Alpha Scholarship

The John T. White and Lambda Chi Alpha Scholarship was established in 2011 in memory of John, who passed away suddenly at age 24. This scholarship is awarded to initiated brothers of the Lambda Chi Alpha fraternity who lived in the house the previous semester. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. For more information, contact Lambda Chi Alpha.



Panama City Alumni & Friends Annual Scholarship

Established in 2011, the Panama City Alumni & Friends Annual Scholarship is awarded to Florida residents who are enrolled at the Troy University Panama City or Marianna Site. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA. The University's Site Director and Panama City Area Alumni Chapter representatives select recipients.

Tim and Sherry Binkley Annual Scholarship

Established in 2011 by Valentines Home Care Center, the Tim and Sherry Binkley Annual Scholarship is awarded to Troy University students with a 3.0 GPA. This scholarship is open to deserving students enrolled in the Sorrell College of Business, in the School of Nursing, majoring in Kinesiology and Health Promotions within the College of Health Sciences, or a student-athlete within the golf program. Applicants are required to submit an unofficial transcript, resume, and three references. Selection is made by the scholarship committee established by the college or department in which the applicant is enrolled.

CCFA Study Abroad Scholarship

The CCFA Study Abroad Scholarship was established in 2012 to assist students with a major or minor in communication and fine arts enrolled in the study abroad program. To be eligible for this scholarship, students must have a 2.8 GPA and be a resident of Alabama. Recipients will be required to complete a study abroad project and either enroll in at least three credit hours of "TROY study abroad credit" or participate in a Troy University international performance tour. The CCFA Executive Committee and the CCFA Advisory Council select recipients.



TROY-Elba Alumni Chapter Scholarship

Established in 2012, the TROY-Elba Alumni Chapter Scholarship is awarded to Troy University students with a 3.0 GPA and financial need. Applicants are required to submit a resume detailing their extracurricular activities. Members of the TROY-Elba Alumni Chapter select recipients.

Harris Security First Responders Scholarship

Established in 2013, the Harris Security First Responders Scholarship is awarded to incoming TROY freshmen who are the children of current, retired, or deceased first responders. First responders are defined as full-time employees of fire, police, E-911, or EMT organizations who have been employed in their profession for a minimum of two consecutive years. To qualify for this scholarship, students must have a 2.5 GPA and be a resident of one of the following Alabama counties: Barbour, Butler, Coffee, Covington, Crenshaw, Dale, Geneva, Henry, Houston, or Pike. The Troy University Scholarship Committee selects recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception held in March. The scholarship donor requires a group photo of recipients with a representative of Harris Security.

Phillip and Melinda Mixon Current Scholarship

Troy University Professor Dr. Phillip Mixon and his wife Melinda established the Phillip and Melinda Mixon Current Scholarship in 2013 to assist students majoring in Economics on TROY's main campus. Applicants must submit a current resume and two letters of reference. Recipients of this scholarship must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA.



Carl Vollrath Current Scholarship

Renowned composer Dr. Carl Vollrath was a member of Troy University faculty for over fifty years before his retirement. During his time at TROY, Dr. Vollrath impacted various groups of students both through his teachings and the Carl Vollrath Current Scholarship. Established in 2014, Dr. Vollrath's scholarship is awarded to students enrolled in the Masters of Business Administration program on TROY's main campus. Students currently enrolled in the program must have a 3.0 GPA, while students entering the program must have an undergraduate GPA of 3.3. To qualify for this scholarship, applicants must be in the 1-2- program and be a graduate of the Lanzhou University of Finance and Economics.

Sorrell College of Business Study Abroad Scholarship

The Sorrell College of Business Study Abroad Scholarship is awarded to full-time undergraduate or graduate students with a major or minor within the Sorrell College of Business. Preference is given to students with a high GPA and a significant amount of scholarly and community activities. Applicants are required to submit their transcript, resume, one letter of recommendation from a faculty member or other professional, and a 1,000-word essay discussing why they should be awarded the scholarship. Scholarship amounts of up to \$750.00 will be awarded to students the semester they are engaging in a study abroad experience. Failure to pass the course associated with the experience will result in the required repayment of scholarship funds. Sorrell College of Business faculty and staff members select recipients in concert with the SCOB Study Abroad Scholarship Committee.



Ty Harvey Current Scholarship

John "Ty" Harvey was a 1996 graduate of Troy University and founder of the "Light in the Darkness" ministry for cancer patients to find peace and purpose through Christ. After Ty passed away at age 34, his parents, Jack and Cheryl Harvey, established the Ty Harvey Current Scholarship to assist Troy University students majoring in journalism. Recipients of this award must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. A committee of representatives from the Office of Development, the School of Journalism Alumni Association, and the Harvey family selects recipients. The Ty Harvey Current Scholarship will be used as a supplement to the award made through the Ty Harvey Memorial Endowed Scholarship.

Carmike Cinemas Employee Development Scholarship

Founded in 1982, Carmike Cinemas was once the fourth largest movie theatre chain in America, with locations in forty-one states. In 2014, in partnership with Troy University, they established the Carmike Cinemas Employee Development Scholarship to provide financial support to employees studying through Troy Online. This scholarship is awarded to undergraduate students who must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA. The Phenix City Scholarship Committee and representatives from Carmike Cinemas select recipients.

Dothan Continuing Education Scholarship

The Dothan Continuing Education Scholarship was established in 2007 by the City Bank of Hartford and is awarded to students attending continuing education courses who need financial assistance. The Director of Continuing Education of the Dothan Campus identifies and awards the funds to students on a need's basis.



Mary Ann and Willian R. Hooten Study Abroad Current Scholarship

Dr. Mary Ann Hooten was a dedicated associate psychology professor at Troy University for over twenty years before she retired in early 2024. While at TROY, Dr. Hooten was passionate about her students and their success, leading her to establish the Mary Ann and William R. Hooten Study Abroad Current Scholarship in 2018 to help fund a study abroad experience for psychology majors. Dr. Hooten's scholarship is awarded to full-time sophomore, junior, or senior students enrolled on TROY's main campus. To be eligible for this award, students must have completed at least thirty hours of academic work at Troy University, be able to demonstrate financial need, and have a 3.0 GPA. Applicants are required to submit a 2–3-page essay explaining why they want to study abroad and what they hope to achieve through the experience. Applicants may be required to have a brief interview with the selection committee if necessary. Upon returning from the trip, recipients must write an essay describing the study abroad experience and what they learned. A committee composed of the Troy University Foundation and a representative from Admissions selects recipients.

Harrel McKinney Current Scholarship for Graduate Study in Economics

Dr. Harrell McKinney is a 1962 Troy graduate, a 2003 Distinguished Leadership Award recipient, and a 2004 Distinguished Alumnus of the Year recipient. As a member of the Troy University Foundation Board of Directors and the Sorrell College of Business Executive Advisory Council, Dr. McKinney is an avid supporter of his alma mater. In 2015, he established the Harrel McKinney Current Scholarship for Graduate Study in Economics to assist students enrolled in the MA Economics program at Troy University's main campus. Recipients of this scholarship must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Applicants will be required to submit a current resume and two letters of reference. Students can contact the Sorrell College of Business for more information on applying.



Hodges Warehouse & Logistics Graduate Current Scholarship

Hodges Warehouse & Logistics has been serving clients in Alabama and across the Southeast since its founding in the early 1970s. In 2015, former CEO Lance Hunter joined forces with Troy University to establish the Hodges Warehouse & Logistics Graduate Current Scholarship for students who have a major or minor within the Sorrell College of Business. Applicants are required to submit their transcript, current resume, and one letter of recommendation from a faculty member or other professional. The Sorrell College of Business scholarship committee selects recipients.

Brian Scott Hammond Memorial Scholarship

Brian Scott Hammond received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Troy University, during which he was an active member of the Lambda Chi Alpha Fraternity. The TROY alumni was only 36 years old when he passed away in late 2012. In 2016, Brian's parents, Claude and Elizabeth Hammond, established the Brian Scott Hammond Memorial Scholarship to honor their son and his legacy. This scholarship is awarded to incoming freshmen, with preference given first to students from Dallas or Wilcox counties in Alabama. To be eligible for this scholarship, students must have a high school GPA of 2.5 and a minimum ACT score of 20. Recipients may reapply for an additional three years if they maintain their 2.5 GPA.



General William "Bill" McDaniel Scholarship

General William "Bill" McDaniel was a two-time graduate of Troy University, a decorated United States Air Force Officer, a tenured University professor, and a beloved community member. After Bill's passing in 2016, Dayna McDaniel established the General William "Bill" McDaniel Scholarship in memory of her father. This scholarship benefits students who are Air Force veterans, on active duty, on active reserve, or have retired military status and are enrolled in TROY's Masters of Public Administration program, Masters of Science in International Relations program, or majoring in political science. To qualify for this scholarship, students must be enrolled full-time and have completed three or more classes with a cumulative 3.8 GPA. The Political Science Department Scholarship Committee selects recipients.

Alabama Marine Foundation Scholarship

The Alabama Marines Foundation is a non-profit corporation that honors, serves, and supports Alabama Marines and their families. In 2015, they established the Alabama Marine Foundation Scholarship to assist veterans transitioning from active military service to college life. Joe Gilchrist Memorial Broadcast Scholarship

In 2016, Becky Kirby established the Joe Gilchrist Memorial Broadcast Scholarship in memory of Joe, who had a passion for amateur radio. This scholarship is awarded to junior or senior broadcast journalism majors with a 2.5 GPA and financial need.



Tabytha Holland Armstrong Memorial Scholarship

Tabytha Holland Armstrong had recently graduated from Troy University as a registered nurse when she passed suddenly in 2016. Later that year, Tabytha's mother, Rene Holland, established the Tabytha Holland Armstrong Memorial Scholarship to honor her daughter's life and passion for helping others. This scholarship is awarded to students recently accepted into TROY's nursing program. Applicants will be required to submit an essay addressing why they chose a career in nursing, their goal in nursing, and what they would have done had they not been accepted into the nursing program. The Troy University Scholarship Committee and Holland family members select recipients.

Bobby Ross and Butch Phillips "Trojan Pride" Annual Scholarship

Troy alumni Bobby Ross and Barbara "Butch" Phillips were avid fans and supporters of their alma mater. In 2016 their son, Bobby Ross Phillips, Jr., established the Bobby Ross and Butch Phillips "Trojan Pride" Annual Scholarship to memorialize his parents and their love of the university. The scholarship is awarded to students who have completed at least two semesters at Troy's main campus and have a 2.5 GPA or higher. Recipients must actively participate in extra-curricular activities, demonstrate leadership skills and actions, and be enthusiastic ambassadors of Troy University, as reflected in words and deeds. Preference is given first to Adel, Georgia, and Cook County residents and then to Berrien, Colquitt, Lowndes, and Tift Counties residents. First preference will also be given to students majoring in math, math education, or other sciences. The Troy University Scholarship Committee selects recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception held in March.



Virginia K. and John R. Miller, Jr. Current Scholarship

Established in 2017, the Virginia K. and John R. Miller, Jr. Current Scholarship is awarded to incoming or transfer students who are children of current employees of T.R. Miller Mill Company, Inc., Cedar Creek Land & Timber Inc., or Miller Investment Group, LLC and have at least five years combined full-time employment. To be eligible for this scholarship, students must have declared a major in any field, excluding theater, arts, or music performance, and be in good academic standing. This scholarship is available to full-time and part-time students; part-time students must be enrolled for at least six credit hours to receive funds. The Troy University Scholarship Committee selects recipients.

Alexis N. Hudson Excellence in Service Current Scholarship

Alexis Hudson is a two-time graduate of Troy University, first in 2015 with her bachelor's in criminal justice and again in 2017 with her master's in leadership. Soon after graduating in 2017, Alexis established the Alexis N. Hudson Excellence in Service Current Scholarship to assist female students entering TROY as freshmen after graduating from high schools in Pike or Covington Counties in Alabama. To be eligible for this scholarship, students must have forty logged hours of community service at a 501c (3) charitable organization or participation in the organization and execution of a personal service initiative that directly improves civic engagement, education, health, or community stability. Applicants are required to submit a current resume, two recommendation letters, and a 500-word essay outlining why volunteerism is important, why they chose to volunteer at a particular organization, and how they plan to serve the community in the future.



Lena Aisami Annual Scholarship

The Lena Aisami Annual Scholarship was established in 2017 by Troy University Professor Dr. Riad Aisami to honor his daughter and provide funding to Syrian students who are qualified for admission at Troy Online in a Master's Degree Program in Special Education, Counseling and Psychology, Vocational Rehabilitation, or any other related field. First preference is given to students from Syrian Refugee Camps in Turkey, Jordan, or Lebanon. As additional funds are generated, it is the donor's desire that the scholarship provide the selected student (s) with a full scholarship to tuition, books, laptop, and other required instructional aids.

Johnny Johnson Scholarship

Joyce Johnson established the Johnny Johnson Scholarship in 2017 to honor the memory of her beloved husband. This scholarship is awarded to Dale, Henry, or Houston Counties residents who are enrolled in Troy University's School of Nursing. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Applicants are required to submit a scholarship application, a resume, and a brief essay explaining their need for the scholarship. Selection of recipients will be made by a representative from Troy University Foundation, a representative from the School of Nursing, and a representative from Admissions.



Stacey M. Cernadas Current Memorial Scholarship

Stacy M. Cernadas was a dedicated flight nurse who had a passion for helping others and was loved by all who met her. In 2018, the Stacey M. Cernadas Current Memorial Scholarship was established to honor Stacey's memory and provide funding to students enrolled in Troy University's School of Nursing. Students must be enrolled full-time on TROY's main campus and have a 2.8 GPA to qualify for the award. Applicants are required to submit a 250–400-word essay on "What This Scholarship Will Mean to My Academic Success." Representatives from the Troy University Foundation and the Stacey M Cernadas Foundation select recipients.

Hidle Trojan Academic Scholarship

In 2018, Troy University alumni Cheryl and Mark Hidle established the Hidle Trojan Academic Scholarship to provide funding to students who achieved a 3.0 GPA. Applicants are required to submit a 200–450-word essay on the topic of "What This Scholarship Will Mean to Me." Recipients are selected by a scholarship committee comprised of representatives from Admissions, the Troy University Foundation, and the Hidle family.



Lorraine Corley Scholarship

After Lorraine Roberts Corley received her nursing degree in 1941, she briefly ran the Troy State infirmary before becoming a public health nurse in Crenshaw and Pike Counties. Lorraine was an icon of public health nursing and nursing in general in Alabama, where she established several benchmarks for women in the field. She was the first woman in the state to be appointed to the position of Public Health Administrator, she served on the original Board for the Edge Hospital and the Alabama Crippled Children's Hospital, and she was instrumental in the establishment of the Charles Henderson Child Health Center. After Lorraine's passing in 2013, the Lorraine Corley Scholarship was established in her memory. This scholarship is awarded to part-time or full-time students pursuing a nursing degree at TROY's main campus in Troy, Alabama. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.50 GPA. Applicants must provide a synopsis of their plans in the field of nursing after graduation and explain why they feel they are deserving of the scholarship. A committee comprised of Dr. Wade Forehand, Dr. Amy Spurlock, and a representative of the Troy University Foundation selects recipients.



Marjorie Hughes Harris Scholarship

Upon graduating from Troy State in 1957 with a degree in business education, Marjorie Hughes Harris worked at Slocomb National Bank for the next fifty years. During her lifetime, Marjorie was selflessly involved in the Slocomb community and instrumental in organizing several associations and committees. After Marjorie's passing in 2017, her family members established the Marjorie Hughes Harris Scholarship to continue her legacy of giving back to others. This scholarship is awarded to full-time students seeking a degree in either business or education on TROY's main campus. Preference is given first to students from Slocomb, Alabama, and second to students from Geneva County, Alabama. Recipients must have a 3.5 GPA and financial need, as evidenced by their FAFSA. Applicants are required to submit a 200–400-word essay discussing their need for the scholarship, what the scholarship means to them, biographical information, and the topic of "How This Scholarship Will Help Me Succeed at Troy University." Representatives of the Troy University Foundation Board and the Harris family select recipients.



Gina Mariano & Fred Figliano Psychology Department Research Conference Current Scholarship

Established in 2018, the Gina Mariano & Fred Figliano Psychology Department Research Conference Current Scholarship is awarded to students presenting at a psychology-related conference not located on a Troy University campus. To qualify for this scholarship, students must be enrolled full-time on TROY's main campus, major in Psychology, and have a 3.0 GPA. Applicants are required to submit one recommendation letter from a Troy University professor. This scholarship is awarded any time throughout the year as a conference may arise, and funds will be used for conference travel, lodging, food, and registration fees. The Psychology Department Chair and Associate Chair selects recipients.

Green Humanitarian Award Current Scholarship

The Green Humanitarian Award Current Scholarship was established in 2018 by Phi Alpha Sigma Society and Troy University's College of Health and Human Services to benefit students enrolled full-time in TROY's Master of Social Work Program. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.5 GPA and attend classes on the Troy, Dothan, or Phenix City Campuses of Troy University. The Troy University Scholarship Committee, the School of Social Work Chair, and the Dean of the College of Health and Human Services select recipients.



Boutwell Farms Music Current Scholarship

The Boutwell Farms Music Current Scholarship was established in 2019 by Jeff Boutwell, a friend of TROY with a passion for the Sound of the South Marching Band. This scholarship is awarded to members of the Sound of the South who are enrolled full-time on the Troy University campus in Troy and wish to pursue a career in music after graduation. Recipients must have a 2.8 GPA and financial need.

Dr. Debora D. Pettway Current Scholarship

Dr. Debora Pettway is a two-time Troy University graduate and former Director of Student Support Services at the Dothan Campus. She recognized the value and potential in her students and encouraged them to achieve their full potential, making her a vital aspect of student success during her time as director. Even though Dr. Pettway is now retired, she is still helping students through the Dr. Debora D. Pettway Current Scholarship. Established in 2019, this scholarship is awarded to returning students with Troy University debt who are involved with Student Support Services and the McNair Scholars Program on TROY's Dothan Campus. Recipients must be enrolled full-time and have a 2.8 GPA. Applicants will be required to provide proof of their prior Troy University enrollment and debt along with a 300 to 500-word essay on their previous experiences at the University and with Student Support Services and the McNair Program. The Troy University Scholarship Committee selects recipients in conjunction with Dr. Debora Pettway.



Troy University Young Leaders Current Scholarship

Troy University alumni Andy Murphree established the Troy University Young Leaders Current Scholarship in 2019 to benefit students from Pike County, Alabama, who have financial need. Recipients must be enrolled full-time on TROY's main campus and have a 2.8 GPA. Applicants are required to submit a 250 to 400-word essay describing how the scholarship will assist them in continuing their education. Members of the Troy University Scholarship Committee, the Foundation, Admissions, and a Murphree family representative select recipients.

Landscape Source, Inc. Current Scholarship

Established in 2019, the Landscape Source, Inc. Current Scholarship is awarded to Troy University students from Montgomery, Alabama, who are enrolled full-time at TROY's main campus. First preference is given to students whose parents are employed by Landscape Source, Inc. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.8 GPA.

Henry G. Sims & Henry U. Sims Memorial Fund Current Scholarship for the Visually Impaired

Established in 2020, the Henry G. Sims & Henry U. Sims Memorial Fund Current Scholarship for the Visually Impaired benefits male students with a visual impairment. Recipients must be enrolled full-time on any Troy University campus and have a 2.8 GPA.



Naazir Yamini Legacy Current Scholarship

Naazir Siraj Yamini attended Troy University from 1998 to 2004, graduating with a Bachelor's in Business Information Systems and a Master's in Business Administration. As a TROY student, Naazir was a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity and a star athlete on the Trojans football team. He served as a middle linebacker and finished his football career as fourth all-time in tackles. When Naazir passed unexpectedly in 2019 at only thirty-nine, Sandra and John Thompson established the Naazir Yamini Legacy Current Scholarship in memory of their dear friend and his gentle soul. Naazir's scholarship is awarded to junior or senior students with a declared major in the Sorrell College of Business on TROY's main campus. Recipients must be enrolled full-time and have a 3.0 GPA. The Troy University Scholarship Committee and a Sorrell College of Business representative selects recipients.

Ed Crowell Current Scholarship

Troy University alumni Brig. Gen. Edward Crowell retired from the United States Air Force in 2009 after a thirty-five-year career. Recognized as one of TROY's Alumni of the Year in 2020, Gen. Crowell has been a long-time member of the Troy University Board of Trustees and the Sorrell College of Business Advisory Council. In 2019, Gen. Crowell established the Ed Crowell Current Scholarship to assist undergraduate students majoring in business. To receive this scholarship, students must be enrolled full-time at the Sorrell College of Business on TROY's main campus. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA.



Kenneth C. Thomas Athletic Current Scholarship

The Kenneth C. Thomas Athletic Current Scholarship was established in 2020 by Thomas and Dana Everage in memory of Dana's late brother. This scholarship is awarded to Troy University second-year baseball players enrolled full-time on TROY's main campus. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. The Troy University athletic director, Deputy Athletics Director, and Baseball Coach select recipients.

Chattahoochee Valley Alumni Chapter Scholarship

Established in 2020, the Chattahoochee Valley Alumni Chapter Scholarship is awarded to full-time Troy University students who reside in Russell or Lee Counties in Alabama or Muscogee or Harris Counties in Georgia. Preference is given to students with a demonstrated need for scholarship support to fund their education and students with a parent, grandparent, or legal guardian who is a TROY Alumnus and/or a member of the Troy University Chattahoochee Valley Alumni Chapter. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA. Applicants are required to submit a statement of a clear vision for how they intend to use their degree in the future and why the selected to attend Troy University. The Chattahoochee Valley Alumni Chapter scholarship committee selects recipients.

Wes and Debbie Rhea Current Scholarship

The Wes and Debbie Rhea Current Scholarship was established in 2020 to benefit students pursuing a degree at the Sorrell College of Business on Troy University's main campus. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.2 GPA. The Troy University Scholarship Committee Selects recipients.



Ozark Presbyterian Church Current Scholarship

For many years, the Ozark Presbyterian Church provided their congregation with a strong community of faith and generosity. In 2020, this generosity extended to the students of Troy University when church leaders established the Ozark Presbyterian Church Current Scholarship. This scholarship benefits incoming freshmen from Dale County, Alabama, who are attending any TROY campus. Recipients must have a 3.0 GPA and financial need, as demonstrated by their FAFSA application.

Sharronah Faye Wright Scott Current Scholarship

Troy University alumni Sharronah Scott was a dedicated and kind soul most fondly remembered for her moments of strength. After Sharronah's passing in 2020, Sharmae Benson established the Sharronah Faye Wright Scott Current Scholarship in memory of her beloved daughter. This scholarship is awarded to students from the Tampa, Florida, area who are pursuing an online degree in mental health counseling and psychology, a degree Sharronah was proud to achieve in 2016. Recipients of this award must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA.



Maj. Jesse Flanigan, IV Memorial Book Scholarship

Troy alumni Maj. Jesse "Jay" Flanigan, IV is remembered as a loving and generous man who embraced all that education had to offer. In 2021, Camellia Flanigan established the Maj. Jesse Flanigan, IV Memorial Book Scholarship in memory of her late son and his legacy. This scholarship is awarded to African-American students from Atlanta Public Schools or Woodward Academy attending Troy University at the Troy, Alabama campus. First preference is given to African-American male students enrolled in the Air Force ROTC. Second preference is given to African-American female students enrolled in the Air Force ROTC. All recipients of the scholarship must have and maintain a 2.8 GPA.

Cheryl E. Nichols Current Scholarship

Troy University alumni Cheryl Nichols was a dedicated educator for over thirty years. She had a deep love for the craft and a desire to help other educators, which is why her sister, Carole Mashburn, established the Cheryl E. Nichols Annual Scholarship after Cheryl's passing in 2022. This scholarship is awarded to students enrolled in the College of Education on TROY's main campus, with preference given to students pursuing a career in teaching. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA.



Box Family Current Scholarship for Education and Music

Troy University alumni Philip Box and his wife are avid supporters of the University; from academics to the athletic teams, the Box family is very TROY-oriented. In 2022, after realizing the many hardships students face in attending college, Philip and Paige wanted to do what they could to help, so they established the Box Family Current Scholarship for Education and Music. This scholarship benefits students majoring in elementary education and music on TROY's main campus, with the awards to each major alternating yearly. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.0 GPA.

Alpha Delta Kappa Alabama Beta Beta Teacher Scholarship

Founded in 1947, Alpha Delta Kappa is an international honorary organization that recognizes and supports the professional efforts of current and future female educators. In 2023, the Alabama Chapter of $A\Delta K$ established the Alpha Delta Kappa Alabama Beta Beta Teacher Scholarship to support future educators from Barbour County, Alabama, who are enrolled in Troy University's Teacher Education Program. This scholarship is awarded to junior or senior students preparing to teach Pre-K, elementary, or secondary grades. Recipients must be in good academic standing to receive the award. If no students from Barbour County are eligible, the scholarship is open to students from any state or county.



Michael A. Clark Music Industry Scholarship

The Michael A. Clark Music Industry Scholarship was established in 2023 by Troy University faculty member Dr. Norman Clark in memory of his late brother. The scholarship is awarded to students pursuing a degree in the music industry on TROY's main campus in Troy, Alabama. Preference is given first to students who are trumpet primaries or members of TROY's POPulus ensemble. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA. Troy University's Director of the Music Industry Program selects recipients.

Joe & Mary Cromeans Charitable Foundation Annual Scholarship

When Gary Cromens founded the Cromens Foundation in 2012, he was not only looking for a way to make a meaningful difference in the lives of others, but he also wanted to honor the legacy of his parents, Mary Ann and Joe Cromens, who spent their lives selflessly giving back to the community. Today, the Cromens Foundation helps advance the field of medicine and broadens the arts by establishing scholarships at universities throughout the South. In 2023, their charitable pursuits reached Troy University by establishing the Joe & Mary Cromeans Charitable Foundation Annual Scholarship to benefit junior or senior students pursuing a degree in either the medical or fine arts field of study. Students in a medical field should be in either the College of Arts and Sciences or the College of Health and Human Services seeking a degree in Biomedical Sciences (Pre-Med), Exercise Science, or Nursing. Students enrolled in a fine arts field should be in the College of Communication and Fine Arts seeking a degree in either the Department of Art and Design, John M. Long School of Music, or the Department of Theatre and Dance. Recipients must have a 3.25 GPA and financial need. The Troy University Scholarship Committee makes selections with possible suggestions from the Dean, Department Chair, or faculty member. Six students from both fields of study are selected annually. The twelve recipients, called the "Cromeans Scholars," receive scholarship funds of \$2,500.00 for the academic year.



Endless Opportunities RMI Scholarship

While a student at Troy University, Douglas Dick was on the receiving end of scholarships provided by the school's generous donors. Douglas decided to pay that generosity forward after graduating from the Sorrell College of Business and entering the workforce. So in 2023, Douglas established the Endless Opportunities RMI Scholarship to benefit students majoring in Risk Management Insurance on TROY's main campus. To qualify, students must be heavily engaged with the RMI program, have a 3.4 GPA, and have completed the Principles in Risk Management and Insurance course. The scholarship is open to excelling junior or senior students, with preference given to seniors. The Troy University Scholarship Committee, the RMI Program Director, and RMI Faculty select recipients to be awarded the scholarship at the annual RMI Banquet.

James F. Rinehart Memorial Scholarship

Dr. James F. Rinehart first joined the Troy University faculty in 1995 at the Fort Bragg Campus but eventually relocated to the Troy Campus when he became the Chair of the Political Science Department. Dr. Rinehart was passionate about learning, teaching, and engaging his students, and in 2012, that dedication resulted in him being named the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences. After Dr. Rinehart's passing in 2015, friends and TROY faculty members began preparing a scholarship to honor his legacy. The James F. Rinehart Memorial Scholarship is awarded annually to graduate students in the College of Arts and Sciences. To apply, students must have a 3.0 GPA and submit a two to three-page essay explaining why they are seeking a master's degree and what they hope to accomplish with their education. The Troy University Scholarship Committee and faculty members from the College of Arts and Sciences select recipients.



Dr. Doug Hawkins Gamma Gamma Alumni Chapter Scholastic Award

Dr. Douglas "Doug" Hawkins was a beloved member of the Trojan family who served as a guiding vision to numerous University projects, including the first doctoral programs, the internationalization of TROY, and the creation of the Greek system on campus. Dr. Hawkins was appointed to the Board of Trustees of Troy State in 1980 and served for the next thirty-five years. He was named the Greek Man of the Year and Honorary Alumnus of the Year and, in 2017, was inducted into TROY's Athletics Hall of Fame. The impact Dr. Hawkins had on Troy University is astounding and still felt today, years after his passing. In 2012, the Pi Kappa Phi Alumni Chapter established the Dr. Doug Hawkins Gamma Gamma Alumni Chapter Scholastic Award in honor of their founder. This scholarship is awarded to active members of Pi Kappa Phi who are in good standing with the fraternity and have achieved an overall 3.0 GPA. Recipients must have lived in the fraternity house for the past two semesters, have a signed contract to live in the house for the following two semesters, or have lived in the house for four past semesters, not including summer semesters. Applicants are required to submit a summary of their academic honors, awards, and fraternity membership activities, as well as an explanation of why they feel they deserve the scholarship. Four Pi Kappa Phi Alumni Chapter members and one Troy University Foundation representative select recipients.

Dr. Lawrence Fogelberg Current Scholarship

Long-time Troy University Fiance Professor Dr. Lawrence "Larry" Fogelberg cared deeply for his students and was a proud member of the Trojan family. In 2014, he established the Dr. Lawrence Fogelberg Current Scholarship to give back to both. This scholarship is awarded to students majoring in financial economics at TROY's main campus. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Applicants are required to submit a current resume, two letters of reference, and a 250-word biographical essay. The Financial Economics Scholarship Committee within the Sorrell College of Business selects recipients.



Dr. Cozetta Dionne Shannon Memorial Scholarship

Dr. Cozetta Dionne Shannon was a dedicated professor at Troy University when she passed unexpectedly at only thirty-five years old. In 2015, Billy and Sylvia Shannon established the Dr. Cozetta Dionne Shannon Memorial Scholarship in memory of their beloved daughter. This scholarship benefits graduate students enrolled in Troy University's Rehabilitation Counseling Program. Recipients must be United States citizens, participate in leadership activities, and have a 3.0 GPA and financial need. Applicants are required to submit a 500-word essay discussing what unique and innovative strategies they would propose as a change agent to achieve social justice and inclusion for multicultural persons with disabilities.

Mary Jean Griffin Outstanding TRIO Student Scholarship Award

Mary J. Griffin served Troy University for forty years, many of which were spent as Director of the University's TRIO programs. As Director, Mrs. Griffin secured millions of dollars in funding for TRIO and was honored with the Chancellor's Award of Distinction in Sponsored Programs. In 2021, Troy University's Associate Provost, Dr. Hal Fulmer, established the Mary Jean Griffin Outstanding TRIO Student Scholarship Award to honor Mrs. Griffin's legacy and long years of service. To receive this award, students must show active engagement with the TRIO program and services. They must also show co-curricular/extra-curricular engagement, service, and leadership skills. Recipients must have and maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 and a 2.8 GPA in their major field. Prospective recipients will be identified through a nomination process, and recipients will be recommended to the Associate Provost and Dean of Undergraduate Studies. Nomination materials must be provided by faculty/staff in support of the recipients. A committee composed of the Associate Provost and Dean of Programs and representatives from TRIO and the JWS Center for Student Success reviews and selects recipients based on the nominations.



Outstanding Political Science Student Current Scholarship

Dr. Sam Shelton, a Troy University Associate Professor Emeritus, established the Outstanding Political Science Student Current Scholarship in 2021 to assist junior or senior students majoring in political science with concentrations in American or International politics. Recipients must have a 3.0 GPA, display excellence in the program, and be active in upper-division classes. The head of the Political Science Department and a representative of department staff select recipients.

Owen Wayne Lewis Memorial Scholarship

Owen Lewis was quick to laugh, always ready with a hug, and eager for the next ride on his "cool bike." Although Owen's time on Earth was cut tragically short, it was brimming with love. In 2022, Owen's parents, Troy University professors Onick and Heather Lewis, established the Owen Wayne Lewis Memorial Scholarship to ensure the love their son had carries forward into the lives of others. Owen's scholarship benefits first-generation college students who are pursuing a degree in social work, human services, or hospitality, tourism, and event management on Troy University's main campus. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA. Applicants are required to submit a 250 to 400-word essay discussing their need for financial assistance and the obstacles they had to overcome to be the first in their family to attend college.



Tom and Erma Parker Annual Scholarship

In 2009, long-time Troy University supporter William C. Watkins established the Tom and Erma Parker Annual Scholarship in honor of his dear friends. This scholarship is awarded to students enrolled in Troy's School of Nursing graduate program who have achieved a 3.0 GPA. To qualify for this scholarship, students must be self-supporting residents of Lee or Russell counties in Alabama or Muscogee or Harris counties in Georgia. First preference is given to students who have demonstrated financial need. Selection is made by Phenix City Scholarship Committee. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.

Foundation Fellowship

Established in 1992, the Foundation Fellowship Scholarships are four annual awards given to junior, senior, or graduate students who have strong leadership abilities. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA and are required to work up to two hours per week with a Troy University staff member. The Advancement Staff Scholarship Committee selects recipients.



Summer Spotlight Scholarship

Since 2009, Troy University's Summer Spotlight Youth Camps have allowed young creative minds to grow and develop their interests and talents in and through the Arts. The Summer Spotlight Scholarship was established in 2015 to fund scholarships for registrants of the camp's various programs, including the Summer Spotlight on Dance, Summer Spotlight Creative Drama Camp "Mini Spotlighters," Summer Spotlight Creative Drama Camp "Spotlighters," and the Summer Spotlight Performance Intensive & Tech/Management Intensive. To be considered for a scholarship, students may apply directly to the Department of Theatre and Dance, or a teacher, counselor, principal, or other advocate may recommend them. Applicants or their parents will need to submit a letter of request for a full or partial scholarship that states an interest in the arts and justified financial need. If the applicant is being recommended, the advocate will need to submit a letter of support on behalf of potential recipients, explaining their creative interest and aptitude in the arts and justified financial need.

Stephen H. Morochnick Scholarship (Caldwell/Koloya/Morochnick Sch.)

Originally established in 1989, the Stephen H. Morochnick Scholarship is awarded to an Active-Duty Airman, E-4 or below, permanently assigned to Maxwell-Gunter AFB or a dependent child or spouse of said active-duty Airman. Recipients must have an overall 2.5 GPA and be unconditionally admitted to Troy University's Montgomery Campus. Applicants are required to submit a typed essay discussing their career and educational goals and how receiving the scholarship will help them achieve those goals.



George E. Barfield Memorial Scholarship

The George E. Barfield Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a Phi Mu Alpha brother in good standing with the lota Nu Chapter. To qualify for this award, students must have a 2.2 GPA, have been a brother for one academic year, and exemplify the truest fraternal spirit in the brotherhood. A committee comprised of two fraternity advisors and one outside faculty member will select recipients based on nominations received from the chapter.

General Scholarship Fund

Troy University's General Scholarship Fund benefits students in financial need due to extraordinary or time-sensitive circumstances.

William H. Carr School of Accountancy Student Sponsors Scholarship

Originally established in 2000, the William H. Carr School of Accountancy Student Sponsors Scholarship is awarded to undergraduate and graduate students enrolled in Troy University's accounting program. To receive this scholarship, students must show academic excellence, have strong leadership characteristics, and have financial need. Graduate student recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA, and undergraduate recipients must have and maintain a 2.8 GPA. Recipients are determined by a selection committee comprised of the Accounting Department Director and faculty members.



Willie Homer Faulkner and Winifred Wilkins Faulkner Endowed Scholarship

Established in 2017, the Willie Homer Faulkner and Winifred Wilkins Faulkner Endowed Scholarship provides financial support to Troy University students from Pike County, Alabama. To receive this award, students must attend classes at TROY's main campus and require financial assistance to attend college. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA. Recipients are required to write a letter of appreciation to the Trust Officer at Troy Bank and Trust and the Office of Development and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.

Dr. Rosemary Canfield Reisman Essay Award Fund

In 1994, John C. Canfield established the Dr. Rosemary Canfield Reisman Essay Award Fund to honor his late mother. To receive this award, senior honor students write and submit essays to be judged by a committee, which then recognizes the most outstanding essay. Winners receive a certificate and a plaque to be displayed in the Dorothy K. Adams Student Center. The winners are presented with their award through the Speech & Drama Department at the annual Honors Convocation.



Doris Weaver Girls Club Scholarship

For decades, the Doris C. Weaver Girls Club has been a place for the young girls of Phenix City, Alabama, to spend their summers learning and developing skills in cooking, ceramics, and crafts. In 2009, the Doris Weaver Girls Club Scholarship was established to assist students who are members of the club with at least three years of proven attendance in either the summer program or the after-school program. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA. First preference is given to students who have demonstrated financial need. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.

Paul-Drennan Family Charitable Scholarship

Established in 1994, the Paul-Drennan Family Charitable Scholarship is awarded to students with financial need. First preference is given to students from Pike County, Alabama. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.0 GPA. The Troy University Scholarship Committee coordinates with the Paul-Drennan Family Charitable Foundation to select recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.



Gary Heath Criminal Justice Scholarship

Gary Heath was a police officer in Greenville, Alabama, when he was killed in the line of duty in 1994. That same year, Gary's father, Joe Heath, established the Gary Heath Criminal Justice Scholarship in his son's memory. This scholarship is awarded to junior or senior students majoring in criminal justice. Recipients must have financial need and maintain a 2.5 GPA. The Troy University Scholarship Committee selects recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.

Nursing ADN Montgomery Loan

The Nursing ADN Montgomery Loan was established in 2005 and is awarded to senior students enrolled in Troy University's ASN program on the Montgomery campus. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. To qualify, students must have completed Nursing 160 and Foundations of Adult Health 1 with a GPA of 1.5, have financial need, and present a sense of professionalism as reflected in the Nightingale Pledge. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.



Psi Chi Award

Established in 1995, the Psi Chi Award is presented to the most outstanding psychology student at the Honor Convocation. Recipients are selected by the Psychology Department.

Mary McLeod Bethune Book Scholarship

Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune was a prominent African American educator, civil rights activist, and Presidential advisor, making her one of the most influential women of her generation. Dr. Bethune was a champion for African American women's rights and advancement and worked tirelessly for education equality. In 2009, Dr. Danell Edwards established the Mary McLeod Bethune Book Scholarship to celebrate the life and honor the memory of Dr. Bethune. This scholarship is awarded to students enrolled in Troy University's elementary education graduate program on the Atlanta, Georgia campus. To be eligible, students must be K-6 educators currently employed by a U.S. public or private school; Troy University employees are not eligible. Applicants are required to submit a written essay of up to 300 words on a topic assigned by the selection committee. Lane Robert McLendon Scholarship

Robert Lance McLendon was a dedicated student, proud brother of Farmhouse, and a member of Campus Outreach during his time at Troy University. While enrolled at TROY, Robert was diagnosed with Chron's Disease, making it difficult for him to continue with his education. However, Robert persevered and graduated with his bachelor's degree in accounting in 1995. In 2001, at only twenty-nine, Lance passed away due to complications from his Chron's Disease. The Lance Robert McLendon Scholarship was established in 2006 by Mac and Joan McLendon to honor their late son and his legacy. This scholarship is awarded to sophomore, junior, or senior students who have achieved a 2.5 GPA and have declared a major. Preference is given to students majoring in the Sorrell College of Business and with financial need. Applicants are required to submit a resume and a short essay describing their financial needs and why they should be considered for the award. Finalists for the scholarship will be interviewed and selected by staff from the Office of Development and McLendon family members. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.



Chasity Barnes Memorial Scholarship

Troy University alumni Chasity Dione Barnes was a headstrong and focused individual who showcased determination in the face of adversity. After her sudden passing following a brief illness in 2009, Chasity's Champions was established. The nonprofit organization is dedicated to creating a lasting legacy of hope and empowerment by awarding scholarships to deserving students. In 2010, Chasity's Champions established the Chasity Barnes Memorial Scholarship at Troy University. This annual book scholarship is awarded to students committed to a Christian life of faith and actively involved in a Christian Bible study organization at TROY. Interested students are required to submit an application and a letter of recommendation from the president or an advisor of the Bible study organization. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.

Rose M. Taylor Current Scholarship

The Rose M. Taylor Scholarship was established in 2013 by Jay and Nicey Eller and Charles Taylor in memory of their dear friend Rose. This scholarship is awarded to students who have been accepted into Troy University's School of Nursing, have a 3.0 GPA, and are currently supporting a family. Applicants are required to submit a brief essay summarizing their situation, their job plans after graduation, and how the scholarship would benefit them. Representatives from the School of Nursing select recipients in conjunction with Mr. and Mrs. Eller. The School of Nursing Scholarship Committee selects recipients in conjunction with Mr. and Mrs. Eller. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.



Patsy Brown Accounting Scholarship

Patsy Brown served the students of Troy University's William H. Carr School of Accountancy for twenty years before her retirement. In honor of the long-time staff member, the Patsy Brown Accounting Scholarship was established in 2013 to assist full-time undergraduate students who have declared a major in accounting. To be eligible for this award, students must have achieved at least a 2.5 GPA on all college coursework, attend classes on TROY's main campus in Troy, Alabama, and have attended TROY for at least two semesters before applying. Applicants are required to submit a resume, a list of their civic activities, and three letters of recommendation. Troy University Accounting Faculty members select recipients and present the scholarship at the annual Accountancy Day program. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.

Robert N. "Cole" DeBardelaben Current Scholarship

When Robert "Cole" DeBardelaben was a sophomore at Troy University, he became the first student in the school's history to fund a scholarship. In 2016, he established the Robert N. "Cole" DeBardelaben Current Scholarship with the hopes of helping students who are focused on academic progress but need financial assistance. This annual scholarship is awarded to students who have received the Millennium Scholarship. The Troy University Scholarship Committee selects recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.



Sorrell College of Business Information Systems Scholarship

Established in 2016, the Sorrell College of Business Information Systems Scholarship is awarded to junior or senior students who are enrolled full-time and majoring in global business with a concentration in information systems. Preference is given to students with a high GPA and a significant amount of scholarly and community activities. Applicants are required to submit a transcript, resume, one letter of recommendation from a faculty member or another professional, and a one-thousand-word essay discussing why they should receive the scholarship. Sorrell College of Business faculty and the Information Systems Scholarship Committee select recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.

TROY for Troops Current Scholarship

Since 1950, TROY for Troops has worked hard to become a comprehensive educational support program that provides veterans, service members, dependents, and survivors the opportunity to succeed in reaching their full potential in pursuing and achieving academic and career goals. In 2016, the TROY for Troops Current Scholarship was established to benefit students who are veterans or are currently serving in any branch of the U.S. Military or their spouses. To qualify for this scholarship, undergraduate students must have 15 credit hours completed at Troy University with a 3.0 GPA, and graduate students must have 12 credit hours completed at TROY with a 3.5 GPA. Applicants will be required to submit a short essay, no more than two pages, describing why they should be awarded the scholarship and their FAFSA. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception. Contact the Office of Development for more information on applying.



The Herget Foundation Current Scholarship

The Herget Foundation Current Scholarship was established in 2017 to fund students majoring in risk management insurance, marketing, accounting, or human resources on Troy University's main campus in Troy. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA. Applicants will be required to submit a current resume along with a 250-word biographical essay. The Troy University Scholarship Committee selects recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.

The Radio People Current Scholarship

Gulf South Communications established the Radio People Current Scholarship in 2018 to assist students majoring in marketing on Troy University's Dothan Campus. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA and be enrolled full-time. The Troy University and Radio People scholarship committees select recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.



The Kevin Glackmeyer Photography Current Scholarship

Kevin Glackmeyer's lifelong passion for photography resulted in a successful career in which he captured and preserved many important historical events and produced photos that will be admired for generations. Kevin served as a news photographer for various publications and the official photographer for three Alabama governors before he became Troy University's chief photographer in 2006, a position he held for eleven years. When Kevin passed in 2017 after battling cancer, friends, and coworkers came together to establish the Kevin Glackmeyer Photography Current Scholarship to honor his legacy and impact at TROY. This scholarship is awarded to students interested in building a sports photography portfolio. Recipients must have a 2.8 GPA and be enrolled full-time at TROY's main campus in Troy, Alabama. For consideration, applicants should submit photographic samples of their work and a one-page written statement related to their need, desire, and interest in athletic photography. The Troy University Scholarship Committee, a Glackmeyere family representative, and Troy University faculty/colleagues of Kevin Glackmeyer select recipients.

Dr. Imogene Mixson Current Education Scholarship

Dr. Imogene Mathison Mixson is a 1959 graduate of Troy State University and a longtime educator with a career spanning thirty-seven years. Dr. Imogene is a member of TROY's Planned Giving Advisory Board and the Trojan Shield Society and an avid supporter of her alma mater. In 2016, she was recognized as Troy University's Alumni of the Year for her various accomplishments in the field of education. Despite being retired, Dr. Imogene remains passionate about promoting educational opportunities, and in doing so, she established the Dr. Imogene Mixson Current Education Scholarship to assist students majoring in education. Recipients must be enrolled full-time on TROY's main campus and have a 2.8 GPA. The Troy University Scholarship Committee selects recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.



Tiffany Slater Undergraduate Broadcast Journalism Current Scholarship

In 2014, Tiffany Slater graduated from Troy University with her bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism. While at TROY, Tiffany received various scholarships, which helped her achieve her educational goals and inspired her to pay it forward. Tiffany was able to do just that in 2018 when she established the Tiffany Slater Undergraduate Broadcast Journalism Current Scholarship to assist African-American students majoring in broadcast journalism on TROY's main campus in Troy, Alabama. To qualify for this scholarship, students must be enrolled full-time, be permanent residents of Georgia, and have a 3.0 GPA. The Troy University Scholarship Committee selects recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.

Great Leaders of Troy University Foundation Current Scholarship

In 2019, Robert DeBardelaben established the Great Leaders of Troy University Foundation Current Scholarship in honor of Mr. Gene Butler, Dr. Jack Hawkins, Dr. John Kline, and Dr. Kerry Palmer, inspirational leaders at TROY who are crucial to the University. This scholarship is awarded to full-time students with a leadership development minor. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.2 GPA and attend classes on TROY's main campus. The Director of the Troy University Institute for Leadership Development selects recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.



Dr. Kathy Murphy Leadership Scholarship

Dr. Kathy Murphy graduated magna cum laude from Troy University in 1981 before going on to have a decades-long career in public education. Now serving as the president of Gadsden State Community College, Dr. Murphy has always had a laser focus and commitment to students. In 2019, she established the Dr. Kathy Murphy Leadership Scholarship to assist full-time education majors enrolled in TROY's College of Education for one or more years. To qualify for this scholarship, students must have a 3.2 GPA and attend classes on the Troy University campus in Troy. Applicants are required to submit a 250 to 400-word essay describing how the scholarship will assist them in continuing their schooling. The Troy University Scholarship Committee and representatives from the College of Education, Foundation, and the Murphy family select recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.

Jim and Linda Weeks Clayton Current Scholarship

The Jim and Linda Weeks Clayton Current Scholarship was established in 2020 to benefit male and female first-generation college students, military personnel, veterans, or dependents of military personnel or veterans of military services. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.25 GPA. Applicants are required to submit a 250 to 400-word essay describing how being awarded the scholarship will assist them in pursuing their education, along with two letters of recommendation from a high school counselor/advisor/teacher/recruiter or someone of equal stature. Representatives from the Troy University Scholarship Committee, Foundation, and the Clayton Family select recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.



Barbara Toner Non-Traditional Student Scholarship

Dr. Barbara Toner was a clinical psychologist, a Troy University professor for fifteen years, and a mentor to countless individuals. Dr. Dionne Rosser-Mims, the Vice Chancellor of Troy University's Phenix City Campus, established the Barbara Toner Non-Traditional Student Scholarship in memory of Dr. Toner and her legacy as an educator. This scholarship supports non-traditional students who are enrolled in an undergraduate degree program. Recipients must be twenty-five years or older, have a 2.5 GPA, and have financial needs. Students enrolled in TROY's Parent Achievement Through Student Success program are given priority. Applicants must provide a letter requesting financial support stating the details of their need and the requested amount. Applicants will also be required to submit a brief explanation of why they feel they deserve the scholarship and one letter of recommendation from a faculty member or advisor. The Phenix City Scholarship Committee selects recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.

Bowden Realty Current Scholarship

Bowden Realty and owner Michael Bowden have proudly served Phenix City and surrounding areas with excellent realty opportunities since 1984. Their impact extended to Troy University students in 2020 when they established the Bowden Realty Current Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to students with a hometown residence in Russell or Lee counties in Alabama. To qualify, students must be enrolled on Troy University's Phenix City Campus and have financial need as demonstrated by the FAFSA. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. The Phenix City Scholarship Committee selects recipients. Recipients must write a letter of appreciation to the donor and attend the annual Scholarship Donor and Recipient Reception.



Kyle Ridgway Memorial Scholarship

The Kyle Ridgway Memorial Scholarship is awarded annually to journalism majors.
