ROBERT M. PAUL SCHOLARSHIP

The Robert M. Paul Scholarship was established in 1988 by friends of Robert to honor his memory. The Dothan Scholarship Committee awards this scholarship to a hard-working student with the highest character and financial need.

W. C. OATES UDC CHAPTER SCHOLARSHIP

The W. C. Oates UDC Chapter Scholarship was established in 1993 by the Alabama Division of the United Daughters of the Confederacy. Recipients of this award must be full-time students on the Dothan campus majoring in Risk Management Insurance with a 3.0 GPA.

GEORGE Y. AND JOHNNIE R. MALONE PERPETUAL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the family of George and Johnnie in 1988, George Y. and Johnnie R. Malone Perpetual Memorial Scholarship is open to Houston County, Alabama residents with a 3.0 GPA and financial need. Applicants must submit an essay explaining why they deserve the award, three letters of recommendation, and a resume.

RUTH ELIZABETH LAPOINT MILNER SCHOLARSHIP (MIXON/MILNER)

Cecil and Ruth Elizabeth Milner established this scholarship in 1986 to assist a mother, housewife, or widow who has made a career as a homemaker and is now seeking a degree in business. The recipient must attend classes at the Dothan campus and have financial need.

SUMTER HILMAN MAJORS, JR. SCHOLARSHIP

The Sumter Hilman Majors, Jr. Scholarship was established in 1992 by Sumter and Elizabeth Majors in memory of their son. The Dothan Scholarship Committee awards this to graduate students enrolled in the School of Education at the Dothan campus. Recipients must maintain a 3.0 GPA and write a one-page essay explaining their financial needs.

EDGAR BERNARD MCDANIEL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Edgar Bernard McDaniel Endowed Scholarship was established in 1988 by McDaniel & Associates in honor and memory of Edgar. Mr. McDaniel, the first Certified Public Accountant in Dothan, Alabama, contributed significantly to the accounting field and the Dothan community. In honor of his impact, this scholarship is awarded to students who demonstrate strong leadership qualities and skills. Recipients must have a 3.2 GPA, financial need, and attend Troy University's Dothan campus.

GEORGE H. MALONE SCHOLARSHIP

Charles H. Chapman, Jr. established the George H. Malone Scholarship in 1999 to honor the memory his late friend. This scholarship provides funds for first-time college freshmen attending TROY's Dothan campus with a major in business and a high school GPA of 3.0. Applicants must submit a written essay explaining why they feel they deserve the award, three letters of recommendation, and a resume.

BROUGHTON & MARION CONNELL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1988 by Broughton W. Connell, the Broughton & Marion Connell Education Scholarship provides financial assistance to Troy University students on the Dothan campus pursuing degrees in business, agriculture, or engineering.

JIM AND GLENDA ROSE SCHOLARSHIP

Established by Jimmy and Glenda Rose in 1995, the Jim and Glenda Rose Scholarship is a perpetual testimony to those who assisted the Roses throughout their college years. Recipients must be graduates of an Alabama public school attending TROY's Dothan campus with financial need and a 3.0 GPA. Applicants will submit a one-page essay describing why they are deserving of the award, three letters of recommendation, and a resume.

STANHOPE E. ELMORE, JR. MEMORIAL BSN SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2016 in memory of Stanhope E. Elmore, Jr., this scholarship provides financial assistance to students accepted to the BSN Clinical Sequence at Troy University Dothan. The recipient, who will be chosen by the faculty/staff of the Troy-Dothan BSN program, must be a full-time student with a 3.0 GPA.

DORA L. MARTIN MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Dora L. Martin Memorial Endowed Scholarship was established in 2023 by Mrs. Martin's estate. This scholarship assists students enrolled on the Troy University Dothan campus.

GENE & JAN ELROD SCHOLARSHIP

The Gene and Jan Elrod Scholarship was established in 1986 by Troy University's Montgomery President, Dr. Gene Elrod, and his wife, Dr. Jan Elrod, a faculty member in the mathematics department at Troy University's main campus and later chair of the department. This scholarship is awarded based on academic performance, character, and financial need. The recipient must attend Troy University in Montgomery and have an overall and last quarter 2.0 GPA.

JANE AND NED VARNER SCHOLARSHIP

In 2007, Jean Gordon established this scholarship in memory of her daughter and son-in-law, Jane and Ned Varner. It is awarded to undergraduate students on the Montgomery campus with a 3.0 GPA. Applicants must submit a one-page essay explaining how the scholarship would benefit them.

DR. CHARLOTTE BILLINGS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP IN EDUCATION

Charles Wright established the Dr. Charlotte Billings Endowed Scholarship in Education in 2009 in memory of Dr. Charlotte. This scholarship assists full-time students attending TROY's Phenix City Campus. Recipients must be education majors currently in their internship program.

MARION RHODES SPEECH & THEATRE SCHOLARSHIP

In memory of her sister, Marion Rhodes, Claudia Graves Crosby established the Marion Rhodes Speech & Theatre Scholarship in 1998. This scholarship is awarded to students whose studies are concentrated in drama and theater.

RALPH W. ADAMS OMICRON DELTA KAPPA AWARD

From 1964 until 1989, Dr. Ralph W. Adams served as the chancellor of Troy University. Under Dr. Ralph's leadership, TROY grew into an international university with strong ties to the U.S. military. Named after the University's first chancellor, the Ralph W. Adams Omicron Delta Kappa Award was established in 1991 to recognize an Omicron Delta Kappa honor society member who showcases exemplary character and leadership qualities. This award aims to promote scholastics, leadership, and community service throughout campus.

GEORGIA IRENE GILL DAVIS AWARD

The Georgia Irene Gill Davis Award was established in 1988 in memory of Georgia, a retired VA Nurse in Tuskegee, Alabama. This scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior in the BSN program with strong professional qualities and a 3.25 GPA.

BERNARD E. WILLIAMS AWARD

Established in 1981, this book award is presented to an outstanding senior English major.

JOHN M. LONG ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

During Dr. John M. Long's thirty-one years as Troy University's director of bands, he promoted the best in his students, music, and understanding the world. Dr. Long had a significant impact not only on Troy University but on generations of musicians, conductors, and music educators across the globe. In 1994, Red and Anne Williams established the John M. Long Achievement Award to honor the TROY legend and to recognize an outstanding graduating Sound of the South Band senior member. Troy University Band Staff selects the recipient of this award based on the highest overall GPA, character, and leadership.

SARA LEE INSLEY DUNBAR AWARD

The Sara Lee Insley Dunbar Award was established in 1996 by Sara Lee to provide an annual award to the Alpha Gamma Delta sorority member with the highest overall GPA. Mrs. Dunbar was a member of the Alumni Chapter, which organized the Gamma Sigma Chapter to Alpha Gamma Delta on TROY's main campus in 1971.

THE ANDERSON SCHOLARSHIP

The Anderson Scholarship was established in 1996 by John "Doc" Anderson in honor of his parents, Margaret and J. H. Anderson. This scholarship is awarded to students majoring in athletic training who have financial need.

VERGIL PARKS MCKINLEY, SR. EMPLOYEE AWARD

Dr. Vergil Parks McKinley, Sr. demonstrated various professional talents while a member of TROY's faculty and profoundly affected the growth and development of the institution. In addition to establishing and directing the Manual Training Department, Professor McKinley also played a vital role in developing the University's athletic program. In memory of their father and father-in-law, John and Helen McKinley established the Vergil Parks McKinley, Sr. Employee Award in 1997. This employee award recognizes the Troy University employees who, through exemplary attitude, innovation, and work ethic, possess a true "Trojan" Spirit. Nominations are received from direct supervisors, and the McKinley Employee Award Selection Committee selects recipients based on the employees' spirit, determination, and ability to excel within their area of responsibility. All Troy University employees are eligible for the award; however, primary consideration is given to non-faculty and non-student staff.

VIRGIL COLLINS MATHEMATICS AWARD

Established in 1998 in memory of former Mathematics Department Chair Virgil Collins, the Virgil Collins Mathematics Award is given to the Mathematics major with the highest GPA in mathematics courses. Recipients must have completed at least six upper-level courses totaling 30 hours and at least 60 hours at Troy University.

HALL-WATERS AWARD & LECTURE SERIES

Troy University Alumni Dr. Wade Hall endowed the Hall-Waters Prize to memorialize his parents, Wade Hall, Sr. and Sarah Elizabeth Waters Hall. The award is presented to an individual who has significantly contributed to Southern heritage and culture in history, literature, or the arts during the preceding year.

WALLACE MALONE OUTSTANDING FACULTY AWARD

This award, named in honor of Wallace D. Malone, Jr., a Troy University Trustee from 1975 to 1995, was established in 2003 to acknowledge exceptional full-time faculty members who, through meritorious and selfless service, transform vision into reality.

INGALLS AWARD

Established by the Ingalls Foundation in 1972, the Ingalls Award is presented annually to any faculty member on the Troy, AL Campus who has most diligently, effectively, and cheerfully conducted their classes during the current academic year. Nominations are made by TROY students, and selection is decided by a committee of students and faculty advisors.

THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION CONTINUING EDUCATION AND RESEARCH ENDOWMENT

The purpose of this fund is to assist any full-time faculty and staff members including Lecturers in the College of Education for continuing education, new research initiatives or independent and collaborative interdisciplinary projects.

HEALTHSOUTH SPORTS MED CHAIR

This fund was created in 1983 to provide certified athletic trainers with the proper education and connections to treat athletes on and off the field. The HealthSouth Sports Medicine Chair holder will provide leadership and communication between academic and clinical preparation of ATCs and the bio-medical research into human performance.

ALFA EMINENT SCHOLAR

This position was established in 1993, and the holder assists in developing closer relationships with the industry to increase student placement, ensure curriculum relevance, assist in developing a network to grow internships, develop new cohort programs, and raise funds to benefit students.

BAKER FAMILY ENDOWMENT FOR STUDENT SUCCESS

Benjamin and Kimberly Baker established this fund in 2023 to support the John W. Schmidt Center for Student Success, primarily the programs and processes that directly benefit students admitted into the ADA program and the programs that provide one-on-one instructional help or tutoring services within the Center.

SHERMAN PROFESSORSHIP

Eugene H. Sherman founded Troy University's accounting program in 1963, and in 1992 Troy University established the E. H. Sherman Professorship in Accountancy in his honor. The purpose of the Sherman Professorship is to provide a salary supplement to the outstanding accounting educator who holds it.

BOB ELL RHODES GRAVES/CROSBY SCHOLARSHIP

Claudia G. Crosby established the Bob Ell Rhodes Graves/Crosby Scholarship in 1992 to honor her mother. This scholarship is awarded to worthy females from Alabama enrolled in vocal/choral classes.

GEORGE M. HUDSON ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

George M. Hudson worked for the Alabama Department of Education for forty-three years, founded Troy University's rehabilitation program, and was named Outstanding Alumnus of the Year in Education in 1973. In 1993, he established the George M. Hudson Endowed Scholarship to be awarded to students majoring in rehabilitation.

DR. JOHN SCHMIDT STUDENT MINISTRIES FUND

The Dr. John Schmidt Student Ministries Fund was established in 2008 to honor Dr. Schmidt for his twenty years of service to Troy University. This fund provides spiritual outreach for student-athletes.

THE KATE AND GIBSON VANCE STUDENT EMERGENCY FUND

The purpose of the Kate and Gibson Vance Student Emergency Fund is to assist students who find themselves in situations where an award of money could help them overcome an issue that could potentially impact their ability to complete their education at Troy University on the Troy, AL campus.

ARMY ROTC ENDOWMENT

The Army ROTC Endowment fund, established in 2008, supports Army ROTC programs and training.

ALABAMA POWER ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established by the Alabama Power Foundation in 1989, this scholarship is awarded to legal residents of Alabama who are full-time undergraduate students enrolled in the Sorrell College of Business.

ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

The National Alumni Association established the Alumni Scholarship in 1993 to provide tuition assistance to freshmen with familial ties to Troy University Alumni. Recipient must have a 23 ACT or 1000 SAT and a 3.3 GPA.

JOHN AND ELOISE ARCHER SCHOLARSHIP

Billy Cannon established the John A. Archer Scholarship Fund in 1988 to honor his former Troy University basketball coach. In 2008, the name was changed to the John and Eloise Archer Scholarship to memorialize Coach Archer and his wife. This scholarship is awarded to graduating seniors of the Pike County, Alabama school system who were members of the boys or girls basketball team. Recipients must possess the highest character, have an ACT score of 18, a GPA of 2.3, and financial need.

OKLA BARNES SCHOLARSHIP

Derlie Barnes established the Okla Barnes Scholarship in 1997 in memory of her brother, Okla, who had a lifelong love and desire of playing musical instruments. This scholarship aims to promote the study of string music in individuals not enrolled in a traditional music degree program. This award will be given to an adult resident of Covington County, Alabama, pursuing a study in string music, with priority given to violin.

DEPARTMENT OF BIOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP

The Department of Biology Scholarship was developed in 1983 by departmental faculty members to be awarded to a biology major of their discretion.

DR. GEORGE ROBERT BOYD AND MRS. LUCILLE KING BOYD DEBATE AWARD

Dr. George Robert Boyd, a former academic dean at TROY, and his wife, Mrs. Lucille King Boyd established this award in 1992 to honor a full-time student who has made outstanding contributions to TROY's debate team. Recipients must have proved themselves to be strong debaters, participate in the University Debate program, and have a 3.0 GPA. Seniors will be given priority, but the award can go to any student of any academic classification.

DR. JESSE HALL COLLEY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1985 by Virginia L. Colley in memory of her late husband, Jesse, the Dr. Jesse Hall Colley Scholarship is awarded to varsity senior athletes on the track and field or cross-country teams with a 2.2 GPA and financial need.

MILDRED BROWN DAVIS SCHOLARSHIP

Mildred B. Davis established this scholarship in 1981 in tribute to her parents and named for her mother, a 1903 graduate of Troy Normal School. Recipient must be a junior, senior, or graduate student with a 3.3 GPA and financial need.

SAMUEL H. HENDRICKS SCHOLARSHIP

S. Kenneth Hendricks established the Samuel H. Hendricks Scholarship in 1987 in honor of his father who was a long-time supporter of the University. Preference for this award goes first to students who are dependents of Henderson, Black & Greene employees. Recipients must have a 2.0 GPA and financial need.

BETTIE HOPPER PERPETUAL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

William F. Hopper established this scholarship in 1982 in loving memory of his mother, a Troy University graduate. The Bettie Hopper Perpetual Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a junior or senior majoring in accounting, with a preference given to student-athletes. Students must have a 23 ACT score and a 3.0 GPA and incoming freshman must have a 26 ACT with a B average to receive this scholarship.

JOHN E. HORNE SCHOLARSHIP

John E. Horn was a 1928 Troy State Teachers College graduate and long-time supporter of the school. He established this scholarship in 1983 to assist TROY students majoring in one of the academic disciplines within the Sorrell College of Business. Recipients must have a 2.0 GPA and financial need.

WILLIAM R. HUDSON SCHOLARSHIP

Hudson Industries, Inc. employees established the William R. Hudson Scholarship in 1979 in memory of the company's president. The scholarship is awarded to students from Pike County High School, Goshen High School, Charles Henderson High School, or Pike Liberal Arts School with preference given to dependents of former Hudson Industries, Inc. employees. Recipients must have a 2.5 GPA and reference letters from a high school guidance counselor, personal friend, and community leader.

TERRY E. AND ROLAND RILEY JOHNSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1983 in loving memory of Terry and Roland Johnson by their family members, this scholarship is awarded to students from Covington County, Alabama with a 2.5 GPA and 20 ACT.

JOHNSTON/COLLEY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1986 by Larry and Helen Johnston in memory and honor of Helen Helms, Walter Johnston, Annette Folmar, and James Colley. The purpose of this scholarship is to assist hard-working students from Pike County who have financial need. Incoming freshman recipients must have an overall 2.4 GPA, and Troy University students must have an overall 2.5 GPA.

JOURNALISM SCHOLARSHIP

Endowed in 1992 through contributions made to the Hall School of Journalism, this scholarship is awarded to students concentrating their studies in journalism. The recipient must be a journalism major with a 2.5 GPA and is required to assist in producing the newsletter.

DR. EMMETT KILPATRICK SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. Emmett Kilpatrick Perpetual Memorial Scholarship was established in his memory by Mrs. John Y. Kilpatrick in 1984 at the request of her late husband. Dr. Kilpatrick joined the faculty of Troy State Teacher's College in 1937 as a French professor and later became chair of the English Department until his retirement in 1961. This scholarship is awarded based on academic achievement and financial need. Enrolled student recipients need a 3.0 GPA and a 23 ACT; incoming first-year students need a 3.0 GPA and 25 ACT.

JEAN LAKE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This award was established by the Troy Council on the Arts and Humanities in 1983 in memory of Jean Lake. Recipients must be from Pike County, maintain a 3.0 GPA, have one year of art in grades 9-12, and plan to pursue a career in visual art or art education.

BYRON LEE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1982 by the Lee family in memory of Troy University alumni Byron Lee. This scholarship is awarded to worthy and deserving undergraduate students based on academic achievement and financial need. Enrolled student recipients must have a 23 ACT with a 1.5 GPA, and entering freshmen recipients a 24 ACT with a 3.0 GPA.

WILLIAM PAUL LEWIS PERPETUAL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1983 by Martha N. Lewis in memory of her husband, William. The W. P. Lewis Memorial Scholarship is awarded to the Kappa Delta Pi W. P. Lewis Award winner.

LUVERNE ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

The Luverne Rotary Club established this scholarship in 1990 to assist hard-working incoming freshmen from Luverne or Crenshaw County, Alabama with high moral character and financial need. Recipients must have an ACT score of 18 or higher or an SAT equivalent, a B average in high school for all core courses, and must maintain an overall 2.5 GPA.

DAVID MALLACH MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP

David Mallach, a 1971 graduate of TROY and 1970 band captain, established this scholarship in 1981 to assist outstanding members of the band who excel in academics. Alternating each year between music and non-music majors, the award is based on academic achievement, financial need, and participation in either concert or marching band. Selected by band staff, recipients must be sophomores, juniors, or seniors who have a 1.5 GPA and who play a musical instrument in either the marching or concert band.

ALICE DUNBAR MOSELEY SCHOLARSHIP

Established in memory of Alice Dunbar Moseley in 1980, this scholarship is awarded to hard working students who possess the highest character. Entering freshman recipients must have at least a 2.0 GPA, and Troy University students must have a cumulative and last semester GPA of 1.5.

T. E. PEEKS SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Established in 1988, the T.E. Peeks Scholarship is awarded to hard-working students who are of the highest character. Recipients must maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 in their major field while incoming freshmen recipients must have a 24 ACT or better and an overall B average in high school.

LARKIN L. REESE SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1973 by Carl E. Reese, Jr. to provide scholarships to hardworking students of the highest character. Troy University student recipients must have a 23 ACT and a GPA of 1.5 and incoming freshman recipients must have a 24 ACT and overall B average in high school.

HUGH G. ROSE SCHOLARSHIP

The Hugh G. Rose Scholarship was established in 1990 through the generosity of Mr. Rose and is awarded based on financial need and academic achievement. Recipients of this award must have a 3.0 GPA and be residents of Alabama, with first preference given to those from Covington County, Alabama. Applicants are required to submit a short essay propounding the tangible and intangible benefits of the free enterprise system.

BLANCHE REYNOLDS SOLOMON SCHOLARSHIP

R. E. "Bob" Solomon established the Blanche Reynolds Solomon Scholarship in 1982 in memory of his late wife, who was a Troy State graduate. Preference for this award goes first to students who graduated from Headland High School, second to students who graduated from other Henry County high schools, and third to students who graduated from other South Alabama high schools. Troy University student recipients must have an overall and last semester GPA of 1.5 and incoming freshman recipients must have at least an 18 ACT and an overall B average in high school.

ELTON B. STEPHENS SCHOLARSHIP

Elton B. Stephens established his scholarship in 1982 to provide worthy students with financial assistance. Recipients must be enrolled in the Sorrell College of Business with a major in marketing, maintain a 2.0 GPA in business subjects, and have financial need. To be eligible, current students must have a 2.0 GPA, and incoming freshmen must have a 20 ACT and B average for the last three years of high school.

CATHY LYNN STEWART SCHOLARSHIP

Cathy Lynn was a 1979 graduate of Troy State and a member of Congressman William L. Dickinson's staff before she passed in a tragic plane crash in November of 1979 in Anniston, Alabama. In memory of Cathy, Congressman Dickinson established the Cathy Lynn Stewart Scholarship in 1980 to be awarded to students majoring in political science. Recipients enrolled in TROY must have a 2.0 GPA and a 22 ACT, and entering freshmen recipients must have a 2.0 GPA and a 23 ACT.

BRIAN STROUD SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1985 in memory of Brian Stroud, this scholarship is awarded to graduates of Goshen High School entering TROY as freshmen. Recipients, chosen by Admissions and the Goshen High School principal, must have at least a 16 ACT and an overall B average in high school.

A. W. & FLORENCE TATE SCHOLARSHIP

Alfred W. Tate established the A. W. & Florence Tate Scholarship in 2002 to assist incoming freshman students from Dale County who have financial need. Recipients must have at least a 24 ACT and an overall B average in high school.

ALICE G. THORNTON ART SCHOLARSHIP

The Alice G. Thornton Art Scholarship was originally established in 1989 by Eugenia Lemon in honor of her most beloved teacher during her time at Troy University. Ms. Lemon established this scholarship to assist hardworking students with financial need. Recipients must have a 3.0 GPA and be accepted to the Bachelor of Fine Arts Program on TROY's main campus.

LEONARD Y. TRAPP SCHOLARSHIP

Virginia Trapp established the Leonard Y. Trapp Scholarship in 1988 in memory of her husband Leonard, who taught at TROY for over forty years. Mrs. Trapp funded this award to honor the outstanding future teacher graduate in the areas of History, Political Science, Sociology, and Social Science Comprehensive. Recipients must be seniors majoring in history or social sciences with a 3.25 GPA and financial need.

PRATTVILLE VOITURE LOCALE 1542 NURSING SCHOLARSHIP

The Prattville Voiture Locale 1542 established this scholarship in 1984 for outstanding students in the nursing baccalaureate program who possess the highest character and have financial need. Preference for this award goes first to students from Autauga County, and second to students from Montgomery, Elmore, or Chilton Counties. Recipients must have an overall and last semester GPA of at least 2.5.

LOIS WATKINS SCHOLARSHIP

The Lois Watkins Scholarship was originally established in 1979 by the Pike County Nurses Society in honor of Lois Watkins. Awarded to hard-working junior or senior nursing students with a 3.0 GPA, with priority given to residents of Pike County, Alabama.

ROSELYN YODER SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 1978 by Dr. Paul Yoder in loving memory of his wife, Roselyn. The Roselyn Yoder Scholarship is awarded to hard-working junior or senior members of Tau Beta Sigma who have a 1.5 GPA and financial need.

PAUL YODER SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. Paul Yoder was a world-renowned composer and arranger of band music, the father of the band movement in Japan, and a former distinguished professor of music at Troy State. Jim Bockman established the Patricia Starck Nursing Endowed Scholarship in 1991 to assist students majoring in nursing.

JOSEPH HARRINGTON HUMAN SERVICES ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2003 by the Department of Human Services and Rehabilitation and the Department of Social Work in honor of Joseph Harrington. Mr. Harrington spent twenty-seven years with TROY, teaching rehab and special education, and was chair of the Health and Human Services Department. The Joseph Harrington Human Services Endowed Scholarship is awarded to students pursuing a major in either human services rehabilitation or social work at TROY's main campus. Recipients must be seniors within one academic year of graduating with a 3.0 GPA.

Recipients must have superior academic achievement as demonstrated by an overall GPA of 3.75.

ALLAN B. FOUNTAIN ART SCHOLARSHIP

Allan B. Fountain, a 1977 graduate of TROY, established his scholarship in 1993 to be awarded to a deserving art major in good academic standing.

Established by the Troy Rotary Club to provide one-year, full-tuition scholarships to incoming freshmen who reside in Pike County. Recipients must have good citizenship and scholarship, an ACT score of 20 or better, and a minimum GPA of 2.5.

MARTHA R. HARLIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Martha R. Harlin was a 1942 Troy State Teachers College graduate who went on to have a long and distinguished career in education. Mrs. Harlin's husband, Edgar F. Harlin, established the Martha R. Harlin Memorial Scholarship in 1992 to assist students preparing for careers in teaching.

HENNIGAN/MORRIS SCHOLARSHIP

Walter and Rebecca Hennigan established this scholarship in 1992 to honor their parents and the Hennigan/Morris families. The Hennigan/Morris scholarship is awarded to motivated juniors or seniors who aspire to be teachers. Recipients must be secondary or elementary education majors and maintain a 2.5 GPA.

The Jennifer W. Bowdin Scholarship was established in 1993 by Kris Bowdin, Forrest Wright, and Charlotte Wright in honor of Jennifer. Awarded to deserving female sophomore, junior, or senior students from Samson High School or Coffee Springs High School. Recipients must have a 3.0 GPA, 18 or greater ACT, and have lettered in one or more of the following high school sports: basketball, volleyball, or softball. Recipients are required to perform fifteen hours of work, designated by the University, during each period the award is accepted.

CAR TAG SCHOLARSHIP

The Car Tag Scholarship program was established with funds received from the sale of Troy University car tags across Alabama. These are non-renewable scholarships awarded to first-time TROY students from Alabama. To qualify, applicants must meet the following requirements: (1) Applicants or their parents must be paid members of the Troy University Alumni Association or one of its chapters and have been so for at least one full year before the scholarship application deadline. (2) One individual in the applicant's immediate family must possess a Troy University car tag. Proof of receipt must be attached to the scholarship application. (3) Entering freshmen must have a 3.0 high school GPA and provide a record of community service. (4) Adult learners or transfer students must have a cumulative 3.0 GPA on all previous college work.

HELEN H. MCKINLEY EXCELLENCE IN NURSING

Established in 1999, the John K. McKinley Scholarship in the field of art/painting is awarded to an art student who is encouraged to make a painting of significant size in either oil or watercolor. The John K. McKinley Scholarship in early childhood education is awarded to a junior or senior student with a genuine interest in teaching. Recipients of this scholarship receive a bonus after one year of teaching employment. The Helen H. McKinley Excellence in Nursing Scholarship (funded by the John K. McKinley Scholarship) is awarded to undergraduate and graduate nursing students who have completed at least two semesters and do not receive federal government assistance, nor are they utilizing a federally-sponsored student loan.

Established in 1999, the Chancellor's Endowed General Scholarship is an assistantship awarded to five international students for one semester. Recipients must demonstrate academic success and financial need.

WILLIAM F. CLIPSON SCHOLARSHIP

William F. "Bill" Clipson was a 1940 Troy State football player and a 1943 graduate. Upon graduation, he became the athletic director, physical education teacher, and head coach for various athletic teams at Troy High School from 1942-1952. Finally, in 1955, Coach Clipson returned to Troy State as head football coach, golf team coach, and assistant academic dean. Coach Clipson was an exemplary leader and crucial community member, so much so that in 1986, Troy's mayor proclaimed January 18th as William "Bill" Clipson Day. Coach Clipson passed away in 1998, and in 2014, the Clipson Alumni Chapter established this scholarship in his honor and memory. This award assists students who are descendants of any athlete who played for Coach Clipson during his time at TROY from 1955 to 1985. If no descendant of a Clipson player is available, then the scholarship may be awarded to a student from Troy, Alabama. Recipients must have and maintain a GPA of 2.5, and preference is given to students with financial needs.

He also served in the Alabama Legislature as a member of the House of Representatives from 1967 to 1971. In 2001, the Alabama Dairy Products Association Curtis Springer Scholarship was established in honor and memory of Judge Springer, a hard worker and dedicated association member. This scholarship is awarded to undergraduate students pursuing a business administration or biology degree.

PATRICK SMITH ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FOR RODEO

THE KASSOUF & CO. ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Kassouf & Co. Endowed Scholarship was established in 2006 by David and Gerard Kassouf of Kassouf & Co., Inc. This scholarship is awarded annually to outstanding and deserving junior or senior students majoring in accounting with a 3.0 GPA. Recipients are known as the "Kassouf Scholars."

EDNA ALLEN BRUNSON SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2007 by the Elba-TROY Club and Jack and Edna Brunson, the Edna Allen Brunson Scholarship is a four-year scholarship awarded to incoming freshmen. To initially receive this scholarship, recipients must be from areas served by the Elba-TROY Club, have a 2.5 GPA, and have an 18 ACT score. This scholarship may be re-awarded to recipients as long as their full-time status and 2.5 GPA are maintained.

SEAY, SEAY & LITCHFIELD SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established in 2006 by Seay, Seay, and Litchfield, PC, to assist students who have declared a major within the Sorrell College of Business. Current TROY students must have a 3.5 GPA, and incoming freshmen must have a 3.5 GPA and a 22 ACT score to receive the Seay, Seay, & Litchfield Scholarship.

SHERLOCK, SMITH AND ADAMS SCHOLARSHIP

Sherlock, Smith, & Adams, Inc. established this scholarship in 2006 to assist students majoring in one of the significant areas of concentration in the Sorrell College of Business. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA, display university or community leadership and involvement, and demonstrate a need for financial assistance to continue their education.

ROY S. GOLDFINGER OPPORTUNITY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Roy S. Goldfinger established this scholarship in 2006 to assist students who have experienced significant difficulties and have demonstrated substantial progress in overcoming those issues. Recipients must be enrolled with a 2.25 GPA and seeking to better their prospects through a college education. The Roy S. Goldfinger Opportunity Endowed Scholarship is awarded by invitation only to students who come to the attention of the Office of Student Services.

WELLS FARGO EDUCATION ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Established in 2007, the Wells Fargo Education Endowed Scholarship is awarded to outstanding and deserving female students and students of color pursuing higher education degrees at TROY. Recipients must be enrolled full-time and have a 3.0 GPA.

SELDEN X. BAILEY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Selden X. Bailey began his military career in 1938 when he joined the University of Alabama's ROTC program. He went on to serve in WWII, during which Mr. Bailey volunteered to organize air-sea rescue in the southwest Pacific and was involved in every air action from New Guinea to Japan. Later, he was on the Alabama Air National Guard state staff, chaired the Third Arm Advisory Committee, and worked with the National Guard Bureau of Washington, D.C. Mr. Bailey established the Selden X. Bailey Endowed Scholarship in 2007 to be awarded to students who have successfully completed a Junior ROTC program in high school. Recipients must be full-time students attending either the Troy or Dothan campuses. Recommendations of candidates may come from the principal of any high school in the Wiregrass Region or from the University's Scholarship Committee.

GREGORY GLENN RILEY SCHOLARSHIP

The Gregory Glenn Riley Scholarship was established in 2007 by the estate of Hazel Sexton Riley, Gregory's mother. It is awarded to full-time students with a 2.8 GPA, with first preference given to students majoring in Psychology.

ETHEL HITCHCOCK GRIFFIN AND MICHAEL REDMON ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Ethel Hitchcock Griffin and Michael Redmon Endowed Scholarship was established in 2007 by Helen G. Harrison in memory of Ethel and Michael. This scholarship is awarded to full-time students from Enterprise, Alabama, who have financial need. Recipients must be education majors and have a 2.5 GPA.

DR. ALBERT KIRBY ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

After receiving his PhD in Neuropharmacology from Northwestern University, Dr. Albert Kirby moved to Enterprise, Alabama. He soon began teaching at Troy State, where he remained for the next twenty years. In 2007, Dr. Kirby's wife, Sherry, established the Dr. Albert Kirby Endowed Scholarship in his memory to be awarded to students from Coffee County who are preparing for a career in the sciences, including the teaching of science. Recipients must be enrolled full-time and have a 3.0 GPA.

NOIA ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Originally established in 2008, the NOIA Endowed Scholarship benefits full-time TROY students who have a hometown residence in the portion of Northwest Florida identified as the Emerald Coast and are served by the Emerald Coast Alumni Chapter. Emerald Coast areas include Okaloosa County, Walton County, and Navarre, Florida. Applications shall consist of two letters of recommendation and a typed essay comprising 250-500 words describing the applicant's educational and career goals and how this award would help achieve them. To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must have participated in a minimum of forty verifiable hours of community service, on or off campus, in the preceding academic year. Applicants must also have and maintain a GPA of 2.8 as of the semester before applying. Recipients are selected jointly by the Emerald Coast Troy Alumni Chapter Endowed Scholarship Committee and the Troy University Scholarship Committee.

FITZHUGH AND ESSIE CARTER ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP

The Fitzhugh and Essie Carter Endowment Scholarship was established in 2018 to assist students entering their freshman year on TROY's main campus. Applications must include documentation of thirty hours of community service/civic engagement during the applicant's last three years of high school and two letters of recommendation, the first from a high school guidance counselor and the second from a person of the applicant's choosing. Students who receive the scholarship must maintain a 3.0 GPA in order to keep the award.

This scholarship is awarded to those enrolled at TROY with a 3.0 GPA.

HAWKINS-WALTERS FOUNDERS SCHOLARSHIP

The Hawkins-Walters Founders Scholarship was established by Troy University's Chi Omega-Iota Kappa Chapter to assist members majoring in nursing. To be eligible for this award, chapter members must be enrolled full-time and have a 2.8 GPA.

TROY UNIVERSITY NURSING ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Troy University Nursing Endowed Scholarship was established in 2009 and is awarded to students majoring in an area of nursing, enrolled in a clinical nursing sequence, and have a 3.0 GPA. The School of Nursing Scholarship Committee selects the recipients of this scholarship.

CAROLE BUTTERWORTH ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

In 2009, Robert Butterworth established the Carole Butterworth Endowed Scholarship in memory of his late wife. This scholarship is awarded to rising sophomores from Shelby County who are majoring in education. Recipients must have a 2.5 GPA and financial need.

Established by Dr. Brenda Riley, Dr. Bernita Hamilton, and the Alabama Nurses Foundation, this scholarship is awarded to students enrolled in TROY's School of Nursing, with first preference given to students in the Doctor of Nursing Practice Program. Recipients of the Riley, Hamilton, and Alabama Nurses Foundation Endowed Scholarship must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA.

BRAD ALVADJ/ECAMPUS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

In 2009, Troy University's eCampus faculty and staff established the Brad Alvaj/eCampus Endowed Scholarship in memory of their late coworker. Bradley Lawrence Alvaj was a 1983 graduate of The Citadel, a former member of the Summerall Guards, and a Field Artillery Officer in the United States Army. During his military career, Brad served in the 24th Infantry Division in Operation Desert Storm. At the time of Mr. Alvaj's passing, he was working at TROY as an academic advisor. The scholarship established in Brad's honor is awarded to students pursuing an online degree with a 3.0 GPA. Applicants must submit a goal statement of no more than 200 words explaining why they are pursuing an online degree from TROY.

To be eligible for this scholarship, students must have a 3.0 GPA, be active within the department, and possess a strong work ethic. The recipients are selected by faculty members in the Department of Kinesiology and Health Promotions.

CHARLES R. CALKINS, JR. ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP IN MUSIC

The Charles R. Calkins, Jr. Endowed Scholarship in Music was established in 2009 by the estate of Mr. Calkins to assist students specializing in keyboards at the John M. Long School of Music. To be eligible for this award, students must currently be studying with the teacher of record for Piano Principles, be active within the department, and have a 2.75 GPA.

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION STUDY ABROAD SCHOLARSHIP

The College of Education Study Abroad Scholarship was established in 2009 and is awarded to students with a 2.5 GPA and a major in the College of Education. This scholarship will be awarded the semester the student engages in a study abroad experience.

Dr. Donald C. Hines, a Mississippi native, dedicated most of his career to the Alabama higher education system. Dr. Hines' impact was not restricted solely to academia; in 1993, he was instrumental in forming Alabama's Water Resource Council. To honor Dr. Hines and his years of selfless dedication to Troy University and the State of Alabama, Sorrell College of Business established the Donald C. Hines Endowed Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to students who have declared a major in the College of Business, have a 2.75 GPA, and are active within the department. Recipients should possess a strong work ethic, genuine care toward others, humility, good citizenship, and integrity.

JACK HAWKINS, JR. LEADERSHIP ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Jack Hawkins, Jr. Leadership Endowed Scholarship was established in 2010 in honor of Dr. Jack Hawkins, Jr. Dr. Hawkins has been the Chancellor of Troy University since 1989, making him the longest-serving chief executive officer of a public university in the United States. This scholarship is awarded to TROY students with a GPA of no less than 3.0 and who have demonstrated strong leadership characteristics in their school, community, and other areas. Applicants must submit a one-page letter describing their leadership roles, service to the community, and how the scholarship will benefit their future goals.

JOE R. AND BARBARA SPORT ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

In 2010, Joseph and Colleen Sport established the Joe R. and Barbara Sport Scholarship to benefit TROY students who graduated from a public school in Crenshaw County, Alabama. Recipients must have a 2.5 GPA, a strong work ethic, and good citizenship.

The Lynn Patterson Deppen Scholarship was established in 2010 by Rene Price in memory of her sister Lynn, a dedicated and loyal friend to many. Emerald Coast areas include Okaloosa County, Walton County, and Navarre, Florida. Applications shall consist of two letters of recommendation from college professors/instructors/recruiters or someone of equal status within the Troy University system and a typed essay comprising 250-500 words describing the applicant's educational and career goals, how this award would help achieve them, and how their first year at TROY impacted their lives. To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must have completed a minimum of one semester at TROY and have participated in at least thirty verifiable hours of community service, on or off campus, in the preceding academic year. Applicants must also have and maintain a GPA of 2.8 as of the semester before applying. Recipients are selected jointly by the Emerald Coast Troy Alumni Chapter Endowed Scholarship Committee and the Troy University Scholarship Committee.

MARION HORNE BEASLEY SCHOLARSHIP

Marion Horne Beasley taught in the Barbour County school system from 1936 until 1981. During her many years as an educator, Mrs. Marion returned to Troy University several times to pursue her love for learning, enhance her teaching, and acquire educational certifications, eventually earning three degrees. In 2010, Jane Beasley established the Marion Horne Beasley Scholarship to memorialize her mother and provide financial assistance to female students enrolled in TROY's College of Education. This scholarship is awarded to students who have enrolled later in life or have returned after an interruption in their education. Recipients of this award must have a 3.0 GPA, be enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate program in which they are pursuing either a degree or certification, and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given to applicants who are currently employed or who plan to seek employment as an educator in a rural Alabama setting and to residents of Barbour County, Alabama. Any applicants currently employed as educators must submit letters of recommendation from school officials or faculty members.

After Ty passed away at age 34, his parents, Jack and Cheryl Harvey, established the Ty Harvey Memorial Scholarship. Ty's family and friends wished to ensure his belief in Jesus Christ, and his love for both Troy University and the fields of Journalism, Speech, and Communications continued. Therefore, this scholarship is awarded to deserving junior or senior students majoring in journalism, speech, or communications. Recipients must be enrolled full-time and have a 3.0 GPA. First preference is given to students who can provide a letter of recommendation from their Christian Faith church leader stating how the applicant has worked to spread the Gospel and students who can demonstrate a personal/family experience with cancer or their efforts in the fight against cancer.

The scholarship is awarded to students pursuing majors in the Interpreter Training program. Recipients must be at least a rising sophomore, have a 3.0 GPA, and have demonstrated financial need.

MERCHANT CAPITAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Merchant Capital Endowed Scholarship was established in 2011 to assist students pursuing majors within the Sorrell College of Business. Recipients must have a 2.5 GPA, be at least a rising sophomore, and demonstrate financial need.

TROYFORTROOPSENDOWEDSCHOLARSHW

The Troy for Troops Endowed Scholarship was established to honor the memory of all veterans who have paid the ultimate price in service to their country and, in particular, to honor the memory of the thirty American military personnel killed on August 6, 2011, in the Extortion 17 helicopter crash in Afghanistan. The purpose of this scholarship is to assist students whose parents were killed or wounded in the line of duty while serving in a branch of the U. S. military. Incoming freshmen recipients must have an ACT score of at least 20; TROY student recipients must have a GPA of at least 2.5; all recipients must be enrolled full-time and demonstrate financial need.

Gena S. Williamson established the TROY's 4-27 Endowed Scholarship in 2011 to assist Troy students who have been direct victims of natural disasters. Applicants must have a 2.5 GPA and financial need to qualify for this award. Applicants must write a 500-word essay describing how they were affected by the natural disaster, the impact on their ability to continue with their college education, and how receiving the scholarship will help them achieve their goals.

COWART AND GEORGIA SANDERS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP IN NURSING

Georgia Mae Sanders attended Troy State Teachers College, where she received her B.S. and M.S. Degrees in elementary education in 1940 and 1959, respectively. She then taught at Troy Elementary School for the next fourteen years. Her husband, Wiley Cowart Sanders, Sr., was a lifelong resident of Troy, Alabama, and co-founder of Sanders Lead Company. The pair were married in 1940 and remained so for sixty-seven years. In 2012, members of the Sanders family established the Cowart and Georgia Sanders Endowed Scholarship in Nursing to assist full-time students in the School of Nursing B.S.N. program. To be eligible, students must be in the last two semesters of their program, demonstrate financial need, and have a 3.0 GPA. Recipients must be United States citizens, at least five-generation Americans, and perform 10 to 12 hours of community service each semester. Community service will need to relate to the nursing field, be pre-approved by nursing faculty, and must not be served in facilities that provide abortions.

HARRY C. "HEINIE" ADERHOLT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Harry Clay "Heinie" Aderholt had a legendary military career that spanned over thirty-four years and three separate wars. During this time, General Aderholt was an American Brigadier General in the United States Air Force and a prominent figure in Air Force Special Operations. Friends and family remember Heinie as a man of integrity who inspired and touched the lives of many. In memory of Heinie and his love of others, his wife Ann established the Harry C. "Heinie" Aderholt Memorial Scholarship in 2012. This scholarship is awarded to education majors on any Troy University campus with a 2.5 GPA. First preference is given to graduates of a Pike County, Alabama, high school; however, if no applicants meet the criteria, the scholarship may be awarded to other applicants. This award is needs-based, as evidenced by the student's FAFSA application. Recipients are chosen by the Troy University Scholarship Committee, a representative of the Office of Development, and an Aderholt family representative.

BESS AND TERRY MIZELLE JAZZ ENSEMBLE ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

In 2012, the Bess and Terry Mizelle Jazz Ensemble Endowed Scholarship was established and dedicated to the memory of Bess and Terry in gratitude for the love of music they instilled in their son, John, despite his refusal to take piano lessons. This scholarship is awarded to members of the TROY Jazz Ensemble majoring in music education, music industry, or any other degree area. Recipients must be at least a rising sophomore, have a 2.5 GPA, and have financial need. Recipients are nominated by the Jazz Ensemble Director and selected by the Troy University Scholarship Committee. Through establishing this scholarship, John hoped that a TROY Jazz Ensemble member would develop the same lifelong enjoyment of musical performance that he has and that they will "Never, never stop playing."

ROSE PATALANO ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

In 2013, Nicholas J. Cervera established the Rose Patalano Endowed Scholarship to honor his aunt and assist students in need of financial assistance to attend Troy University. To receive this award, students must have a 3.0 GPA and be at least a rising sophomore.

After graduating from Dothan High School in 1973, Terry Lamar Collins attended Troy State on a baseball scholarship, where he received his bachelor's and master's degrees in 1978 and 1986, respectively. In 2001, Terry earned the Troy University Distinguished Alumni of the Year award. In 2009, he was inducted into the Troy University Baseball Hall of Fame. In memory of Terry and his legacy, his wife, Judy, established the Terry Collins Endowed Scholarship in 2013. The scholarship is awarded to students majoring in business or education, with preference given to students from Houston County. Recipients of this award must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA.

DR. IMOGENE MATHISON MIXSON ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. Imogene Mathison Mixson graduated from Troy State College in 1959 with a degree in English education. Dr. Mixson went on to work as an educator in the Wiregrass Area for thirty-seven years. In 2016, Dr. Mixson was named one of Troy University's Alumni of the Year for her dedication to her profession and community. Since 2021, she has served as Troy University's Associate Director of Athletic Training and Chief Health Care Administrator. Alyson has significantly impacted TROY's athletic and athletic training programs, including establishing the Athletic Training and Leadership Endowed Scholarship in 2014. This scholarship assists graduate students enrolled in the athletic training program who have a 3.0 GPA and financial need. As part of the application process, students are required to submit a 500-word essay describing how the scholarship will help them achieve their goals. Troy State Teachers College alumni Mabel Sanders Amos was the first woman elected to the Alabama Secretary of State position, which she held from 1967 until 1975. In her memory, the Mabel Amos Endowed Scholarship was established in 2014 by her estate. This scholarship is awarded to students who have declared a major in the College of Arts and Sciences, with preference given to those with a major related to politics or governmental affairs. To be eligible, current undergraduate students must have a GPA of at least 3.0, and incoming freshmen must have a 3.5 GPA or a 22 ACT score.

JOAN ROBERTSON ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

In 2014, the estate of John Leofsky established the Joan Robertson Endowed Scholarship in memory of his wife to assist students majoring in English. To be eligible, current undergraduate students must have a GPA of at least 3.0, and incoming freshmen must have a 3.5 GPA or a 22 ACT score.

JIMMY AND WANDA GARDNER ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Wanda Morgan Gardner received her bachelor's in mathematics and master's in math education from Troy State University in 1970 and 1972, respectively. James "Jimmy" Gardner, Wanda's husband, received his bachelor's in mathematics from Troy University in 1975. In 2000, Wanda was given TROY's Alumni of the Year award, and in 2012, Jimmy received the very same distinction. The couple shared a love for mathematics and their alma mater, which is why, in 2015, Wanda established the Jimmy and Wanda Gardner Endowed Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to students majoring in math who have a 3.0 GPA, with preference given to residents of Butler County.

The Student Alumni Association Endowed Scholarship was established in 2015 by Troy University's National Alumni Association. Recipients must be members of the Student Alumni Association and have a GPA of 2.5. Applicants are required to interview with the scholarship committee and submit a 2–3-page essay explaining why they are seeking a degree and what they hope to accomplish with their education.

AL LUCAS MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

In 2015, Troy University's Birmingham Area Alumni Chapter established the Al Lucas Memorial Scholarship for the purpose of providing financial assistance to students who graduated from Northeast High School in Macon, Georgia. Recipients of this award must be enrolled full-time on TROY's main campus and have a 3.0 GPA. If no students from Northeast High School are eligible, the scholarship will be available to students from any high school in Bibb County.

They must also indicate any scores on law school admission tests, acceptance by law schools, or applications to schools of law, which may be pending. To be eligible, students must submit a one-page essay describing their leadership roles, service to their community, and how the scholarship will benefit their future goals. In 1968, the Troy State Red Wave football team finished their season with an 11-1 record, which advanced the team to the NAIA playoffs. On December 14, 1968, led by their head coach Billy Atkins, the Red Wave defeated Texas A&I, 43-35. This win secured the program's first national championship. In 2021, the 1968 football team members came together to establish the "Forever First" Endowed Scholarship. This scholarship is awarded to students who are direct descendants of any member of the 1968 National Championship Football Team. First preference is given to students who have shown a need for support to fund their education, as demonstrated by a FAFSA application. Recipients of this award must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA. Applicants are required to submit a 300 to 500-word essay describing their vision for how they will use their degree after graduating. Recipients are selected by a committee composed of the 1968 National Championship Football Team and the Troy University Scholarship Committee. Recipients are required to write a thank you letter to the donor and must attend the scholarship donor and recipient reception held each March.

DAKE DAVIS MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Dacre "Dake" Davis was an avid Troy University fan and never missed the Trojan athletic teams' playing on the home field. In memory of Dake and his caring spirit, William Garret Godwin established the Dake Davis Memorial Endowed Scholarship to assist Troy University students from Pike County, Alabama. Recipients of this scholarship must have and maintain a minimum GPA of 2.8. Applications must include a 300-word essay discussing their community involvement. Recipients are selected by the Troy University Scholarship Committee and a family representative.

JOHN B. MAZYCK LEADERSHIP ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The John B. Mazyck Leadership Endowed Scholarship was established initially by John in 2021 to assist students who demonstrate a servant's heart and have financial need. The first preference for this scholarship is given to students from Montgomery, Alabama. Recipients must maintain a 3.0 GPA and attend classes at Troy University's Montgomery or Troy campus locations. The Troy University Scholarship Committee selects recipients under the authority of the Chancellor.

ALABAMA BROADCASTERS ASSOCIATION ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Alabama Broadcasters Association Endowed Scholarship was established in 2021 to assist students majoring in communications with a focus on either radio or television. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Priority consideration is given to junior or senior students from Alabama.

MURRAY AND GEORGE R. O'NEAL MATHEMATICS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

James Frank O'Neal was a native of Troy, Alabama, and a member of Troy University's staff for forty years, sixteen of which he served as Chairman of the Mathematics Department. In 2021, the Murray and George R. O'Neal Mathematics Endowed Scholarship was established by Mr. O'Neal's estate in memory of his parents. This scholarship is awarded to full-time students with a declared major in mathematics or mathematics education. To be eligible for this scholarship, students must be residents of Alabama or Florida, be enrolled in a mathematics course of calculus or higher, and enroll in a mathematics course each semester until all mathematics requirements have been met. Recipients must maintain an overall GPA of 2.75 and a 3.0 GPA in their major field.

DOTHAN CIVITAN "EARL BUTTERWORTH" ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

The Dothan Civitan "Earl Butterworth" Endowed Scholarship was established in 2021 by the Dothan Civitan Club in loving honor of Robert Earl Butterworth, a 1971 graduate of Troy State. This scholarship is awarded to full-time students from Houston, Dale, and Geneva Counties who are enrolled on any Troy University campus. First consideration goes to students with special needs who must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA. Second consideration is given to students pursuing a degree focusing on special needs who must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Applicants with special needs must submit a 300-word essay on "How My Disability Has Affected My Educational Journey." Applicants pursuing a degree focusing on special needs must submit a 300-word essay on "Why I Chose a Degree to Help Those with Disabilities." Recipients are selected by a committee composed of the Troy University Foundation, a representative of the Dothan Civitan Club, and the Troy University Scholarship Committee.

JOHN P. CROSS ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

TROY alumni John P. Cross established the John P. Cross Endowed Scholarship in 2013 to assist students who have demonstrated a need for support to fund their education. Recipients of this scholarship must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA. To be eligible for the award, students must be at least a rising sophomore from one of the following states: Alabama, Georgia, Florida, Mississippi, Tennessee, South Carolina, North Carolina, Virginia, Kentucky, Arkansas, or Louisiana.

Lamar P. Higgins was a 1981 Troy graduate and the Vice President Pro Tempore of the University's Board of Trustees for twenty-five years. Higgins made history as a student at TROY, becoming the first African American to be elected as Student Government Association vice president and president. After graduating, Lamar provided his alma mater with a lifetime of dedicated leadership and support. Higgins was instrumental in planning and constructing the Rosa Parks Library and Museum on TROY's Montgomery Campus and established the Leadership Conference Celebrating African American History Month. After Lamar's passing in 2021, Troy University established the Lamar P. Higgins Endowed Scholarship to honor the life and legacy of such an influential figure. Preference for this scholarship is given to graduating seniors from Valiant Cross Academy and current Troy University students who are members of the Alpha Phi Alpha fraternity. Recipients must have and maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0.

SARAH ANN WHALEY MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Sarah Anne Whaley was a lifelong resident of Troy, Alabama, and a beloved member of the community. Miss Sarah Anne taught piano at Troy University for many years and was a Troy Music Study Club member. In 2021, the Sarah Ann Whaley Memorial Endowed Scholarship was established in memory of the local legend. This scholarship is awarded to music majors attending TROY's main campus in Troy, Alabama. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA.

Marcus Hall is a 1998 Troy State graduate and a Sorrell College of Business Advisory Council member. In 2021, Marcus and his wife Christy established the Hall Stewardship Endowed Scholarship to assist single parents from the Wiregrass Area (Coffee, Dale, Henry, Geneva, and Houston Counties) who are Troy University students attending classes on either the Troy or Dothan campuses. Recipients of this scholarship must have and maintain a 2.8 GPA.

MAJ. JESSE FLANIGAN, IV MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

TROY alumni Maj. Jesse "Jay" Flanigan, IV is remembered as a loving and generous man who embraced all that education had to offer. In 2021, Camellia Flanigan established the Maj. Jesse Flanigan, IV Memorial Endowed Scholarship in memory of her late son and his legacy. This needs-based scholarship is awarded to male African-American students from Atlanta Public Schools or Woodward Academy. First preference goes to African-American males enrolled and enlisted in the Air Force ROTC, second preference to African-American males with a family military background, and third preference to African-American male or female students enrolled in ROTC or with a family military background. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.8 GPA, attend classes on Troy University's main campus in Troy, Alabama, and submit a copy of their FAFSA application to demonstrate financial need.

CHERYL COLLEY DICHIARA ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FOR NURSING

Cheryl Colley DiChiara was a true Trojan and a dedicated medical professional who was an integral part of the medical practice she and her husband built in the Troy community. After graduating from Charles Henderson High School in 1969, Cheryl enrolled at Troy State, where she was a majorette in Sound of the South Band, a member of Phi Mu, and achieved her nursing degree. In 2021, Dr. Mickey DiChiara established the Cheryl Colley DiChiara Endowed Scholarship for Nursing in memory of his late wife and her dedication to the field. This scholarship is awarded to students accepted to Troy University's Nursing Program, with preference given to qualified students from Pike or Lee Counties in Alabama. If no qualified students from Pike or Lee Counties apply, applications from students outside that area will be considered. In order to qualify, applicants must show proof of admission into the clinical sequence of classes within the Nursing Program. Recipients of this award must have and maintain any and all GPA requirements as listed by the acceptance and continuation policy of the nursing school.

KENNETH DUANE JOHNSON SIGMA CHI ENDOWMENT

In 2022, the Kenneth Duane Johnson Sigma Chi Endowment was established in loving memory of Kenneth, a Sigma Chi brother and alumnus of TROY. This scholarship benefits students on the Troy University campus in Troy, Alabama, who are freshmen pledges of Sigma Chi Fraternity who need financial assistance to cover the cost of joining. To be eligible, students must meet all standards and requirements of the Sigma Chi Fraternity. Recipients are selected by a scholarship committee composed of Sigma Chi Advisory Council members, the Associate Dean of Student Life for Troy University Student Services, and a member of the Office of Development.

The Mark and Wendy Riva Endowed Scholarship was established in 2022 by Mark and Wendy in memory of Diane Riva, a dedicated educator and mother. The purpose of this scholarship is to assist students from Sarasota County, Florida, who are attending the Troy University Campus in Troy, AL. First preference goes to Chemistry or Biology majors, and second preference goes to any science major. Preference is also given to students who have shown a need for financial support, as demonstrated by a FAFSA application. Recipients of this scholarship must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Applications must include a 300 to 500-word essay describing the student's vision for how they will use their degree upon graduation.

Troy State alumnus Robert Cary and his wife Judy were married for fifty-seven years after meeting in Troy in the 1960s. Judy was a passionate and dedicated nurse for many years, and in 2022, Robert established the Judy and Robert Cary Nursing Endowed Scholarship to honor his late wife. This scholarship is awarded to students accepted into the nursing program on TROY's main campus. Recipients may be full-time or part-time and must maintain a 2.75 GPA. The funds received may be used to assist students with tuition, uniforms, supplies, books, or other items needed for specific nursing classes.

Glenda Armstrong received her bachelor's degree from TROY in 1993, and the impact of her professors and their instruction ignited within her a desire to give back to her alma mater. In 2020, Glenda and her husband, Donald, established the Glenda Fay (Hood) Armstrong Legacy Endowed Scholarship to benefit students enrolled in the College of Education on TROY's main campus. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.8 GPA. Preference for the scholarship is given to students who: (1) Are returning to college after being gainfully employed in the workforce. (2) Have prior experience in the military service of the United States of America and are not on the G.I. Bill. (3) Are surviving spouses with no prior work experience. (4) Are a single parent. (5) Are a resident of Alabama. Each year, one or more students are selected to receive this award.

Recipients must have and maintain a 2.5 GPA and attend the Troy University campus in Troy, Alabama. Recipients are selected by a committee led by the Theatre and Dance Department Chair.

DR. LESLIE S. BLACK ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. Leslie Black is a two-time alumna of Troy University and a member of the College of Health and Human Services Advisory Council. Dr. Black credits her time at TROY for helping to lay the foundation for her career success. In 2023, she established the Dr. Leslie S. Black Endowed Scholarship to provide those same opportunities to future TROY students. Dr. Black's scholarship assists students from Cordova, Alabama, pursuing a degree within the College of Health and Human Services of the Sorrell College of Business. However, if there are no eligible applicants from Cordova, the scholarship is open to applicants from any city and state. Awarding preference is given first to African-American applicants and second to other minority applicants. Recipients must have and maintain a 2.75 GPA and attend the TROY campus in Troy, Alabama.

This scholarship is awarded to students enrolled in the Pre-Optometry Program on the TROY campus in Troy, Alabama. Preference is given to students who received an associate degree in Pre-Optometry from the Dothan campus of Wallace Community College. Recipients must have and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Two recipients are chosen annually to receive an award covering half of their tuition.

OWEN WAYNE LEWIS MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Owen Lewis was quick to laugh, always ready with a hug, and eager for the next ride on his "cool bike." Although Owen's time on Earth was cut tragically short, it was brimming with love. In February of this year, Owen's parents, Troy University professors Onick and Heather Lewis, established the Owen Wayne Lewis Memorial Endowed Scholarship to ensure the love their son had carries forward into the lives of others. Owen's scholarship assists students majoring in social work, human services, or hospitality, tourism and event management on Troy University's main campus. Recipients must be first-generation college students with a 2.5 GPA. Applicants are required to submit a 250 to 400-word essay describing their need for financial assistance and the obstacles they had to overcome to be the first in their family to attend college.

Preference for this scholarship is given to students from Chilton County, Alabama. WILSON-WILLIAMS STUDENT EMERGENCY FUND

TROY alumni Mary and Jerry Williams established the Wilson-Williams Student Emergency Fund in 2017 to help students facing emergency financial situations that could affect their ability to stay enrolled at Troy University. The emergency fund is available to Troy Campus students, with preference given to working students, military veterans, and students with parents in law enforcement. Mary and Jerry established this fund as a last-resort option for students with unexpected expenses such as emergency medical bills, housing costs, or emergency transportation repairs. This fund is not used for expenses such as books, tuition, travel, non-emergency medical costs, or needs caused by a student's use of alcohol, drugs, or any illegal activity. A three-person committee overseen by the Dean of Student Services reviews applications and controls fund distribution. Recipients are not required to repay the money but are encouraged to pay what they can to help maintain the fund's viability. Matthew Spencer Awbrey graduated from Opelika High School in 2023 before enrolling at Troy University. While at TROY, he became an active brother of the Farmhouse Fraternity and served at the Wesley Foundation. Matthew is remembered for his gentle spirit, devout faith, and contagious laugh. After Matthew passed suddenly in 2023, James and Jodi Wells knew they wanted to honor his memory. So, they established the Matthew Spencer Awbrey Farmhouse Memorial Endowed Scholarship. Matthew's scholarship is awarded to pledges or brothers of Farmhouse Fraternity who meet all the standards and requirements of the organization and have a 2.7 GPA. The Troy University Office of Student Services selects recipients.
