1. Registration Form

2. Letter of Recommendation

- a. 1 letter of recommendation should be provided for new prospective members.
- b. Letters of recommendation should be sent directly to troyauxiliary@troy.edu from the recommender, NOT from the auditionee.
- c. Letters of recommendation must come from a band director, auxiliary coach/coordinator, or studio instructor.
- d. Letters of recommendation from teachers, professors, parents, other family members, or bosses will not be accepted.
- e. Additional recommendation letters will not be considered in scoring.

3. Interview

- a. Interested students must complete an interview with the Auxiliary Coordinator and judges on the day of auditions.
- b. Please dress professionally for your interview.
- c. Be prepared to answer questions about your previous experience in auxiliaries, your experience working with others, and how you can contribute to the SOTS Auxiliaries.

. In-Person Audition

- a. On April 5, 2025, potential new members will demonstrate several basic skills, a pre-choreographed individual routine, a pregame routine and a routine that they will learn on the day of auditions. Videos of the required basics will be provided in advance.
- b. Students should demonstrate professionalism and appropriate audition etiquette throughout the audition process.
- c. In-person auditions are closed to the public, including parents and family members.
- i. Basic skills (16 counts of all, except tosses)
 - 1. Right drop spins
 - 2. Speed spins

- 3. Stirs/cones
- 4. Butterflies
- 5. Extensions
- 6. Windmills
- 7. Front-to-backs
- 8. Side-to-sides
- 9. 1 turn under double toss
- 10. Single catch behind the back
- 11. 45-degree toss
- 12. Parallel toss
- 13. J-toss
- 14. Marching (heel-to-toe)
- 15. Jazz runs
- 16. T-R Routine
- ii. Group Routine
- 1. A short routine (less than 1 minute in length) will be taught on the day of auditions and will be performed by prospective members.
 - iii. Individual routine
- 1. Prospective members should choreograph a routine that highlights their skill and performance.
- 2. Individual routines should be 1 minute and 30 seconds to 1 minute and 45 seconds in length.
- 3. The routine may be performed to the song of your choice but should not contain questionable or inappropriate lyrics.
- 4. You may choose to include rifle in your individual routine. If you choose to do so, you must still include at least 1 full minute of flag work. The remaining time may be used for rifle or flag work.
- 5. You must submit your audition music to <u>troyauxiliary@troy.edu</u> as an audio file by April 1, 2025.

Attire

- For the basic skill and group routine portions of the audition, prospective members should wear all black, well-fitting dance/athletic attire (shorts/leggings and tank top) with jazz dance or guard shoes. Sneakers are acceptable.
- Hair should be all down and curled.
- Makeup should be flattering and tasteful. We want to see your version of "game-day ready." A flattering shade of red lipstick is required for females.
- You may choose to change into performance attire for the individual routine portion of the audition, but this is not required.

• NO Troy/Sound of the South uniforms may be worn.

Equipment

- Flags will be provided for basic skills and group routine portions. You must use the provided equipment.
- You may bring your own for the individual routine or use the provided flags.
- Rifles will not be provided for individual routines.
