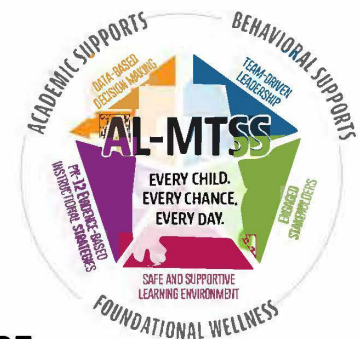

What is the cost to participate?

The competition is FREE for schools to participate. At the bare minimum, the only costs your team will incur are expenses related to traveling to/from Troy for the competition events. Troy University BEST Robotics will loan robot equipment to the participating schools for the duration of the 8-week build and competition period. All materials must be returned after the competition is completed.

## How can I get involved?

Start a team

Each school can enter only one team in the competition (this includes public, private, and home schools). There is no limit to the number of students that may participate on each team. Space in the Troy University competition is limited to 16 teams.

The following are recommended as you start your team:

**Advisor/primary point of contact** – A person, typically a teacher within the school, to coordinate the efforts of the team and communicate with the Hub for competition information and updates.

**Workspace** – An area with basic workshop tools to aid in building the robot.

**Mentors**—Professionals (may be parents or other affiliates) from the area who are willing to help the students with their robot. Often, mentors will include engineers, skilled workers, or those willing to help with building, learning, or problem-solving.

**Funding** – The competition is free; however, there may be minimal travel costs to Troy. Additionally, many teams create and wear a team t-shirt to the competition (and even have an opportunity to enter the shirt for an award). Other costs may include building a practice field, etc.

**Interest** – A group of students motivated to build a robot, write and organize an engineering notebook, and optionally design a team exhibit and deliver a marketing presentation.

**Time commitment**—Participating in BEST requires enthusiasm, motivation, and, most importantly, time dedicated to helping your team and students. The eight weeks (56 Days of BEST) are fast-paced and packed with activity: be prepared.

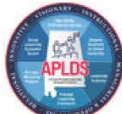

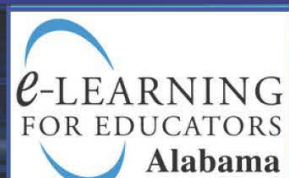

## Southeast Alabama Model United Nations

### Model United Nations

The Wiregrass Writing Project and the Southeast Alabama Regional Inservice Center at Troy University will host the Southeast Alabama Model United Nations Assembly (SAMUN), March 5 & 6, 2026. Students will have the opportunity to experience the United Nations first-hand. Each delegation, limited to 7 students, will represent a different nation and decide important issues that affect the world.

### Native Dress

All delegates are expected to dress in native dress of their nation.

### Nation's Flag

Each nation's delegates shall make their own nation's flag. The flag must be made out of fabric, foam or felt, and the dimensions are to be precisely 9 inches by 11 inches. The flag is to be attached to a stick that is 18 inches long. A holder should also be prepared that will enable the flag to sit on the desk of the nation's delegation.

NOTE: The flag will be used by all nations' delegates to gain recognition in the General Assembly and will be used in the opening Roll Call of Nations.

### Roll Call of Nations

At the opening session, a roll call will be made of every nation present. One member of each nation's delegation will give a 30-second welcome in the native tongue of the nation; a second delegate will interpret in English (more on this in the confirmation packet).

### Number of Delegations

The number of delegations will be limited to 30. Delegations must be accompanied by a teacher, but can also have parents assist the advisor.

ENFORCED TO GIVE TEAMS ADEQUATE TIME  
TO PREPARE FOR SAMUN.**

A request for a nation will be made by completing the attached PRE-REGISTRATION sheet. **The deadline for the pre-registration requesting a nation is October 21, 2025.** Upon receipt, the SAMUN Committee will notify each advisor their assigned nation(s) via email the following week. ### Resolutions & Registrations

Each advisor must submit a Delegate Registration Form by **December 3, 2025** and Resolution for each nation by **December 3, 2025**.

**Resolution Book:** After all resolutions and registration forms listing all delegates' names are received, the SAMUN Committee will distribute one copy of the Resolution Book to each registered delegate and advisor. We will also provide a Resolution Book for the number of parents listed on the Delegate Registration Form. The Resolution Book will contain all Resolutions, plus other information to be used in preparing a delegation to attend SAMUN.

## Sample Resolution

### Resolution Introductory Phrases

After you send in your Pre-Registration and Nation Selection Form, you will be notified by the SAMUN Committee of your Nation. Then begin preparing your resolution.

Preparing a Resolution can be an exciting part of SAMUN preparation. Be sure to involve every member of your nation in its preparation.

The Sample Resolution presents one idea. There are hundreds of others dealing with such subjects as world hunger, terrorism, boundary disputes between nations, establishing a study committee, nuclear weapons, pollution, education reform and others. However, be sure that you first study your nation and how it stands on world issues. Your Resolution should be written from your nation's point of view. The material you receive from the SAMUN Committee will help you begin studying more about your nation. The library will also provide information. Remember, you will be attending SAMUN as a representative of a nation. You're to act and think as closely as possible to that nation.

Before you get started with you Resolution, study the PREAMBULATORY and OPERATIVE clauses.

Each Resolution is a single sentence, with the different sections separated with semicolons and commas. The Resolution is divided into two parts: perambulatory and operative clauses.

**PREAMBULATORY CLAUSES:** These are the justifications for actions. They usually begin with present participles and denote Charter authorizations for actions, past Resolution precedents and statements about the particular purposes for the action.

**OPERATIVE CLAUSES:** These are the policy portion of the Resolution. Each of these starts with a verb, and taken as a whole, deals thoroughly with one idea arranged in a logical progression. Each clause should not be a collection of unrelated thoughts or statements on a broad topic, but should deal with only one aspect of the problem.

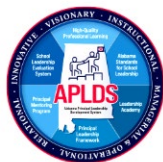

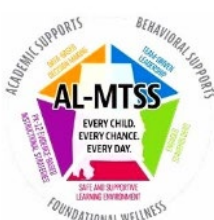
