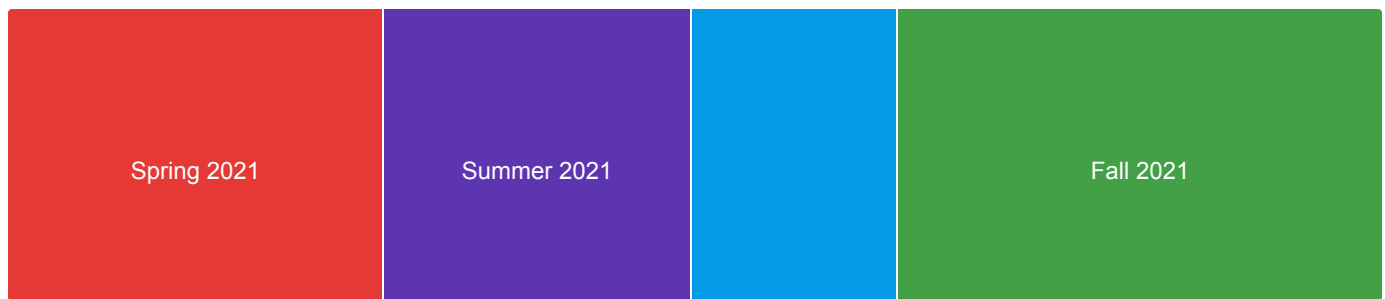

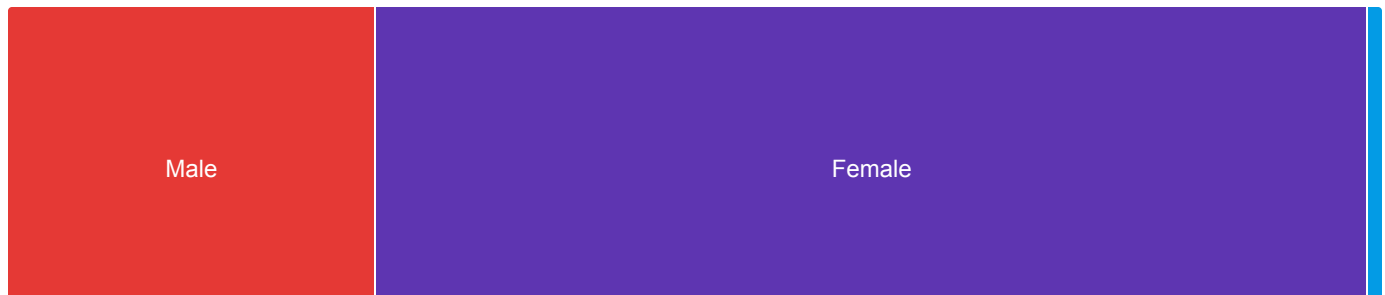
The Office of Institutional Research, Planning, and Effectiveness (IRPE) conducted the Graduate Student Survey in spring 2021. The purpose of the survey was to identify the satisfaction of the fall 2020, T1, T2 and T3 graduate students, recognize student development as a result of their Troy University education, and identify areas that need to be improved. Data collected in this survey are used to help the University strengthen its graduate degree programs, better serve the needs of its students, and become more effective and efficient in accomplishing its mission and goals. The survey was administered through the online survey program Qualtrics via email to a group of 4,947 students. The target population was students who were classified as graduate students during fall 2020, T1, T2 and T3. After two follow up emails on April 26, 2021 and May 10, 2021, a total of 426 responses were received, representing a 8.6% response rate.

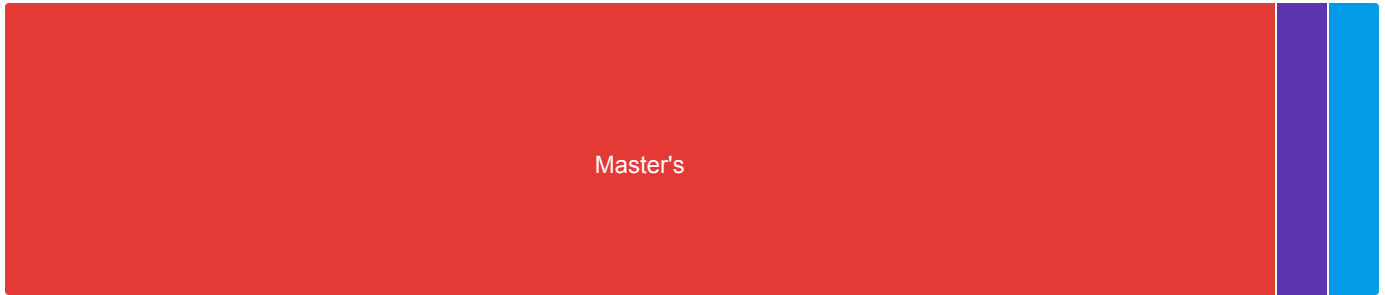
Q11 - 8) From which Troy University campus will you graduate?

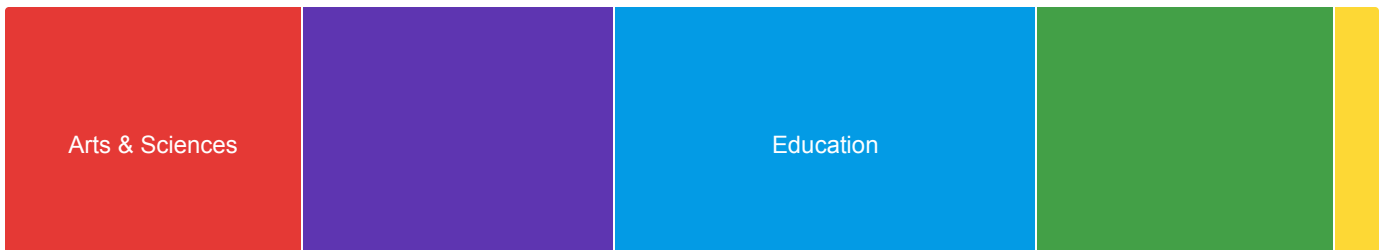

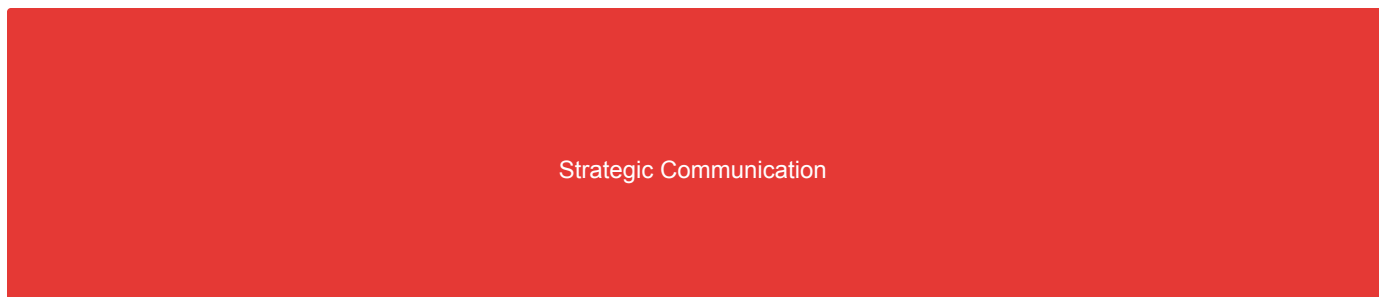

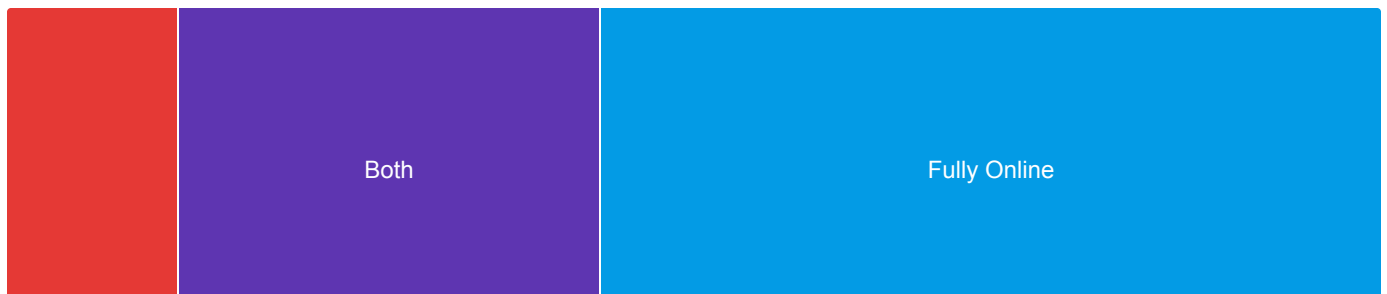

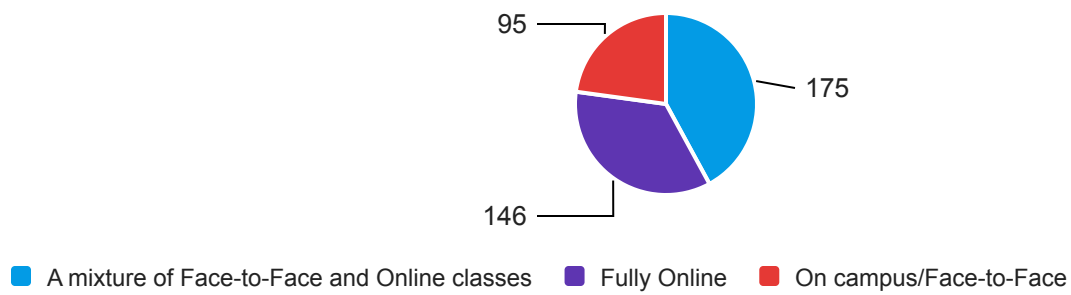

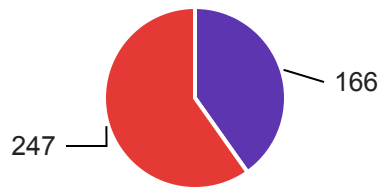

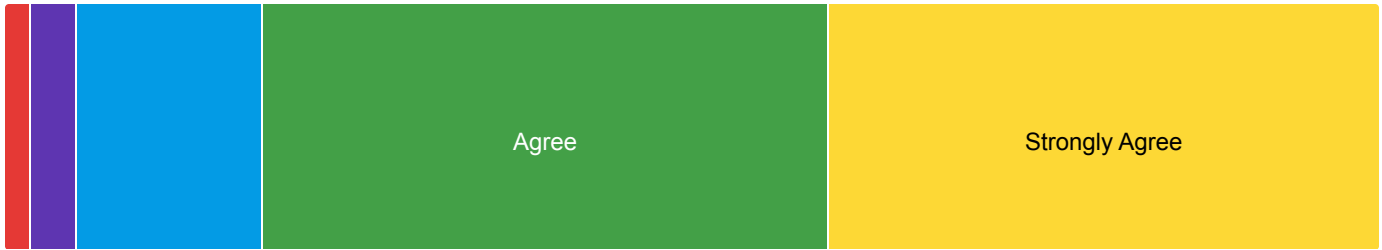

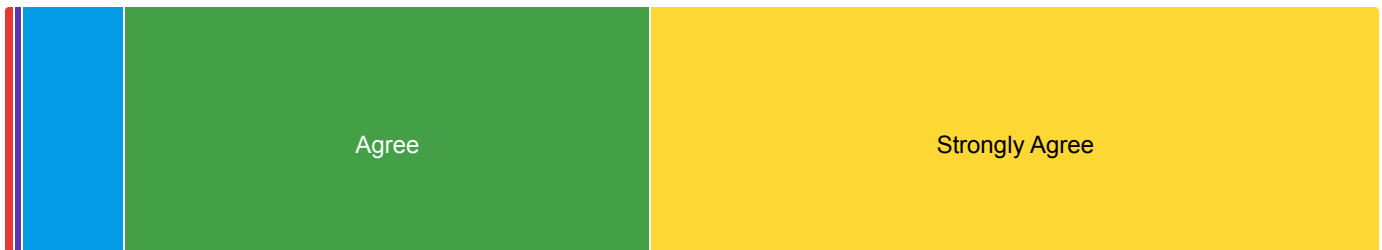

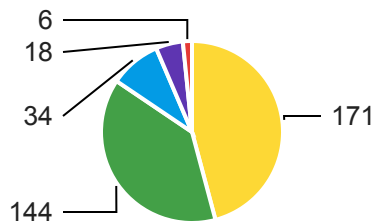

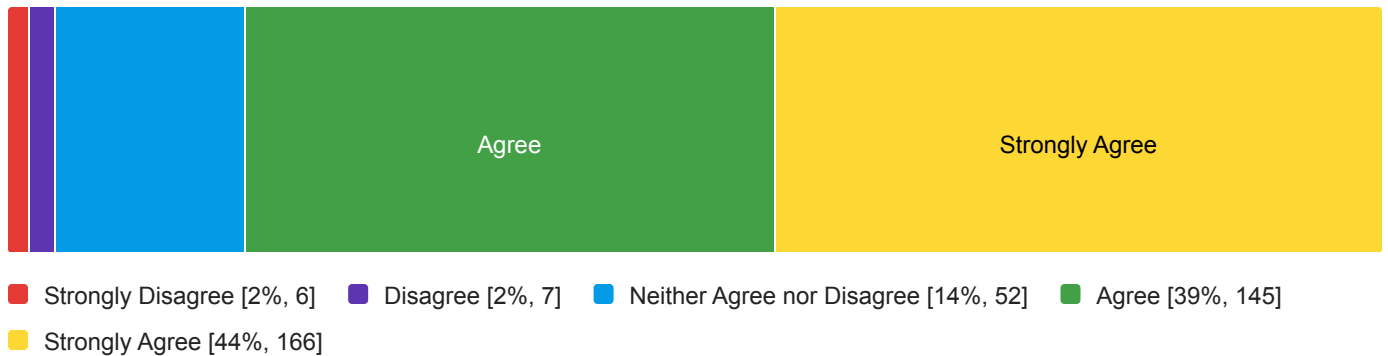

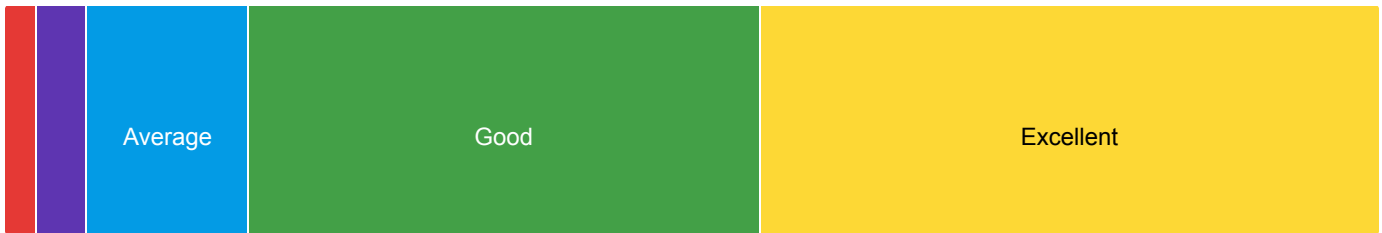

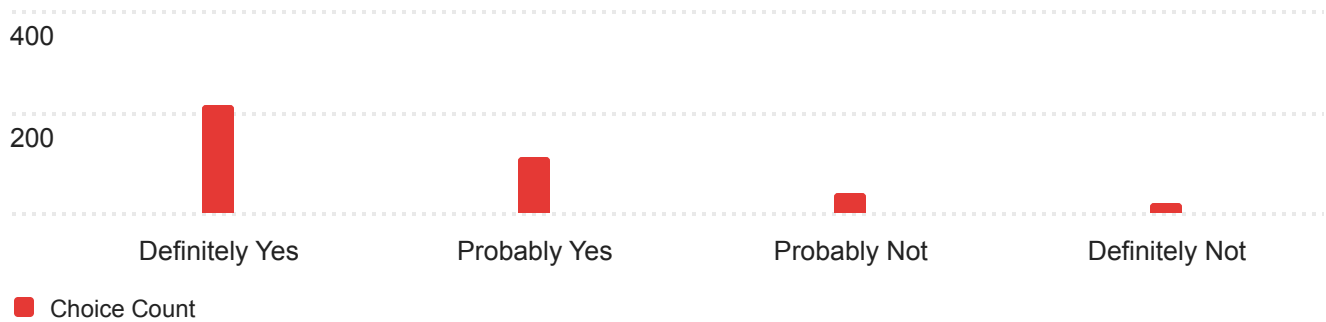

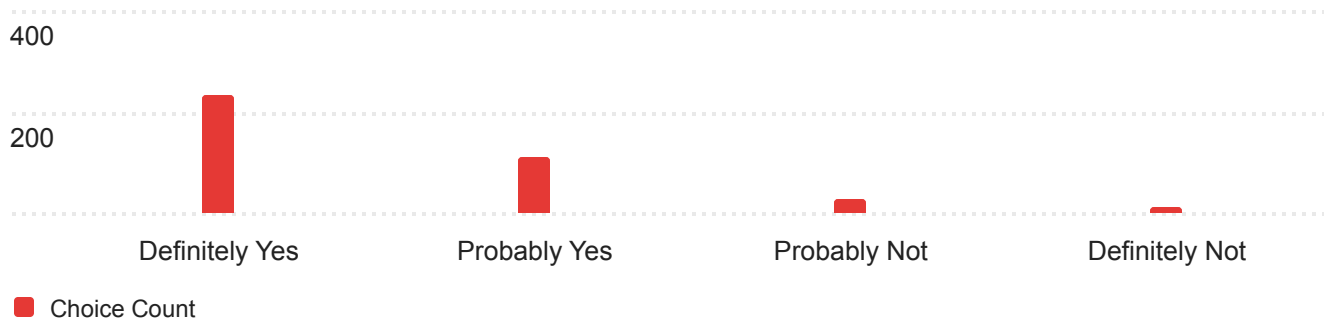

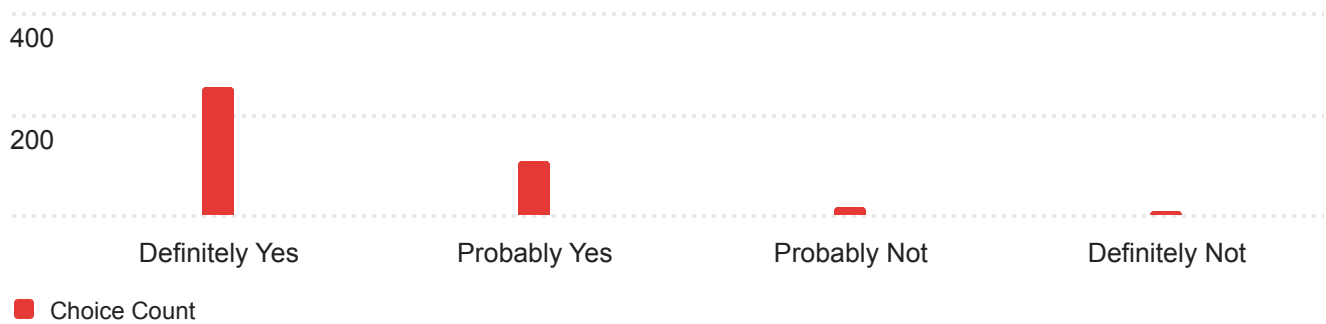

Troy University is a good School for those who have a full time job and is affordable considering the quality of education.

In regard to my program area of counseling education, I believe that the professors genuinely taught to the best of their ability. I feel as though I have been truly lucky to have attended each of their courses. One recommendation that I have is that for courses to stress the importance of the CPCE, a comprehensive exam that must be passed in order to graduate. I feel that student preparedness, learning, and scores on this exam would greatly improve if CPCE preparation guides were offered for the specific content in each counseling course.

I personally felt that the MSN-FNP program during the last semester did not prepare us for national boards. There was no direction, instruction, or utilization of studies to prepare us for success. I have compared Troy to other colleagues and their universities. It would be my recommendation to incorporate studies toward a review and NP prep class as oppose (or in addition to) a poster presentation. Overall, when reaching out to faculty the respond was timely but there is not an individualist approach.

I attended Troy for my undergraduate degree in art, this Masters I was required to take more art and was able to take classes in art practices that were not available to me in 1990.

Love the education department, they make sure all teachers follow state guideline.

If I started over, I would probably get an MBA instead of the MPA program because it would be more useful in the corporate world.

Overall, I have really enjoyed attending Troy University. I would and have recommended the school to other people interested in graduate school. The only constructive criticism I have for Troy is regarding the Library. It is difficult to navigate and has too many search features. I always had difficulty navigating the Library and often wished that I could enter my class number and databases relative to the class content would automatically filter. If this type of method of searching is already embedded in Troy's Library, I did not know how to use it.

My other comments are for some of the professors. I am nearing the completion of my program and feel that there were some professors who were not particularly helpful and seemed discouraging at times. Making comments like "most people struggle to make a "B" in this class" is not particularly helpful and is discouraging to students that entrust the university with helping them achieve their educational pursuits. Some of the professors, I feel are not invested in the success of the student and only upload the syllabus and assignments and interact very little with the class unless providing snarky comments when grading assignments. I also think that Troy should make it mandatory for professors to round grades of 76 and above up to 80. I received one "C" while attending Troy and my final grade was I believe a 77 or 78. The professor who assigned the grade is among the group of professors mentioned who seem arrogant, condescending, and unconcerned with providing the educational understanding that we as students are paying for.

The poor mask compliance is why I would not choose to attend the Troy University campus again.
