Bachelor of Science Criminal Justice



Program Purpose: The purpose of the Criminal Justice Program is to provide students with basic knowledge of the criminal justice system to include law enforcement, the courts, corrections and all of the specific career fields associated with the discipline.

To prepare students, through this knowledge and acquired intellectual skills, for adding to the quality of the criminal justice system through employment in the field as a professional, or for adding to its quality as citizens in shaping policy through their understanding and support.

To prepare students academically so that they may be accepted into graduate programs in criminal justice (including the program at Troy University), in criminology, and/or related fields such as sociology, public administration, political science, psychology, and human services.

To prepare students who graduate with a bachelor's degree in criminal justice for admission to law school.

While this program will enjoy wide appeal from CCAF students studying a broad range of career fields, it is believed that this program will be of particular interest to CCAF students completing the AAS degree in **Criminal Justice**, **Cybersecurity**, **Intelligence Studies and Technology**, **Human Services**, **and Paralegal**. It may also have interest for CCAF students completing the AAS in **Business Administration**, **Emergency Management**, **Education Training and Management**, **Occupational Safety** or **Strategic Operations Management**.

The BS Degree in Criminal Justice at Troy University **requires**:

- 1. **48** hours of General Studies classes
- 2. **36** hours of Criminal Justice classes including **15** semester hours of the Criminal Justice core and **21** semester hours of Advisor Approved upper level Criminal Justice electives.
- 3. **18** semester hours of a **Military Operations** minor (usually satisfied by technical education classes at CCAF).
- 4. **18** hours of free electives (approved by Academic Advisor)

Please note that CCAF students who have taken Law Enforcement and Security courses in their AAS Program at CCAF may receive additional transfer credit for equivalent coursework successfully completed. In such cases, the distribution of transfer credits to TROY may be different than is represented.
