

Bachelor of Science in Hospitality, Sport and Tourism Management Concentration in Sport Management



The Hospitality, Sport and Tourism Management (**HSTM**) program of study at Troy University is committed to providing students with the highest quality educational experiences so that they will be prepared to meet the many demands and challenges of sport management in the 21st century. The purpose of the sport management concentration is to prepare students for careers as program directors, marketing and promotion directors, event managers, facilities directors, compliance directors, athletics directors, sport retail managers and other related positions within interscholastic, intercollegiate, professional or recreational sports. TROY's HSTM major is among a select few that are nationally accredited by the Commission on Sport Management Accreditation (COSMA).

While this program of study will enjoy wide appeal from CCAF students studying a broad range of career fields, it is believed that this major will be of particular interest to CCAF students completing the AAS degree in **Allied Health Services**, **Dietetics and Nutrition**, **Health Care Management**, **Restaurant Hotel and Fitness Management**, **Survival Instructor** and **Physical Therapist Assistant**. It may also have interest for CCAF students completing the AAS in **Cardiopulmonary Lab Technician** and **Personnel Recovery**.

The BS Degree in Hospitality, Sport and Tourism Management at Troy University is a 122 semester hour program and **requires**:

- 48 hours of General Studies classes
 In addition to the Intermediate Algebra course which is part of
 the CCAF curriculum, this program also requires the
 completion of Troy University's MTH1112, Pre Calculus
 Algebra. CCAF students will likely need to complete not less
 than 9 hours of General Studies requirements at TROY to
 include MTH1112.
- 2. 51 hours of major courses.
- 3. 18 semester hours of a **Military Operations** minor (usually satisfied by Technical Education and LMMS classes at CCAF).
- 4. 3 hours of advisor approved electives and 2 hours of physical activities classes.

CCAF graduates *may* transfer up to 60 semester hours into this program leaving a balance of 62 semester hours to be completed at Troy University.
