

Bachelor of Science Occupational Education



Program Purpose: The purpose of the Bachelors of Science in Occupational Education (BSOE) is to provide a pathway for individuals with specialized skills to earn a bachelor's degree designed to provide expertise in the design, delivery, and practice of instructional programs for adults in a variety of professional and technical vocations including online education, workforce development, continuing education, higher education, and military education.

Upon successful completion of the BSOE, graduates will be able to develop curricula for adult learners. discuss the different ways in which adults learn and how to assess their needs, interests, motivations, and capabilities, apply specialized knowledge related to their occupational area to practical classroom situations and articulate a personal adult education teaching philosophy. Additionally, airmen and civilians who choose this specialization could pursue postsecondary faculty, corporate training, or adult education positions in the fields of higher education, business, and nonprofit or community-based education.

While this program will enjoy wide appeal from CCAF students studying a broad range of career fields, it is believed that this program will be of particular interest to CCAF students completing the AAS degree in **Aviation Maintenance Technology, Construction Technology, Education and Training Management, Instructor of Technology, Mechanical and Electrical Technology and Military Science and Occupational Safety.**

It may also have interest for CCAF students completing the AAS in **Metals Technology** and **Vehicle Maintenance.**

The BS Degree in Occupational education at Troy University **requires**:

- **1. 60 semester hours of General Studies credits** (this course work should include courses that satisfy the General Studies requirements at Troy University. Should this not be the case, students will need to complete the general Studies requirements at TROY).
- 2. 30 Hours of credentialed work related experience which could include ACE recommended credit for professional military technical education and or Technical Education component of the CCAF degree.
- 3. 30 semester hours of Troy University Professional Core classes.
