

Bachelor of Science Political Science



Program Purpose: The purpose of the undergraduate program in political science is to provide knowledge and skills necessary to prepare individuals for: (1) entry level leadership positions in government service, public management, or the military; (2) a sufficient level of academic skills necessary to gain entry into and succeed in advanced, graduate study in the field of political science or post-graduate professional education, such as law school; and (3) work in a position in the private sector, such as journalism, communication, and business where knowledge of politics, public policy or governmental relations is of particular importance

While this program will enjoy wide appeal from CCAF students studying a broad range of career fields, it is believed that this program will be of particular interest to CCAF students completing the AAS degree in **Intelligence Studies and Technology, Mass Communications, Human Services, Public Affairs,** and **Social Services.** It may also have interest for CCAF students completing the AAS in **Emergency Management** or **Education Training and Management**.

The BS Degree in Political Science at Troy University requires:

- 1. 51 hours of General Studies classes
- 36 hours of Political Science classes including 18 semester hours of required upper level classes and 18 semester hours of specialized approved upper level classes for a concentration in American Politics & Public Administration or International Politics.
- 3. 18 semester hours of a **Military Operations** minor (usually satisfied by technical education classes at CCAF).
- 4. 15 hours of free electives (approved by Academic Advisor)

Please note that CCAF students who have taken Political Science and or Public Administration

Courses in their AAS Program at CCAF may receive additional transfer credit for equivalent coursework successfully completed. In such cases, the distribution of transfer credits to TROY may be different than is represented.

As per the below, 15 semester hours of General Studies should transfer from the CCAF AAS Degree to TROY University to fulfill the following requirements: ENG1101, MTH1110 (Finite Math) or MTH1112 (Pre-Calculus Algebra) (a grade of C or higher is required in English and in Math), Communication (Area II), Humanities (Area II), Social Science (Area IV). Students who have taken a Math course at a lower level than those above will not receive credit for this course and will be required to successfully complete the course at TROY.
