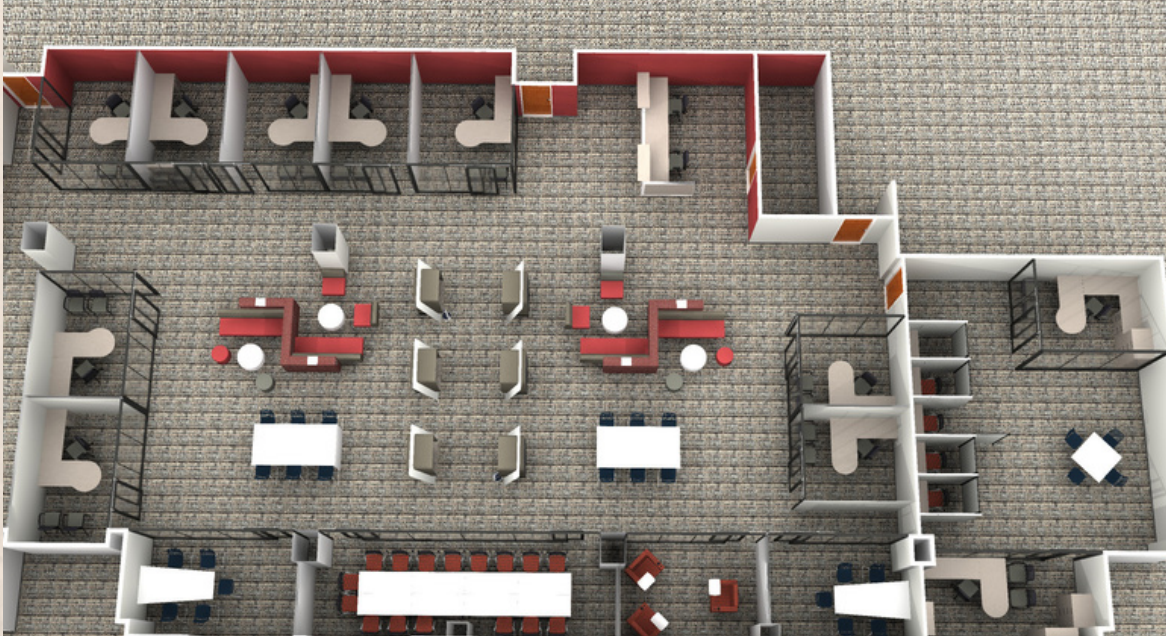

Virtual Meeting Etiquette



1. **Join Early**- Make sure your microphone & camera are working properly.
2. **Dress Appropriately**- You'll also put yourself in the right headspace to be productive.
3. **Beware of Your Surroundings**- Make sure your background is tidy, professional & work appropriate.
4. **Mute Your Microphone When You're Not Talking**- Avoid noisy distractions while others are speaking.
5. **Stay Seated & Stay Present**- Sit up straight, don't make big extraneous movements & always give your attention.
6. **Minimize Distractions**- Avoid rustling papers, eating, or making other distracting noises or movements in the background.
7. **Give Grace**- Be patient with participants & allow some grace to any miscommunications.
8. **Plan for an efficient Wrap-Up**- End with a quick recap providing decisions made & actions agreed on.
