A Note from the Title III Project Director:

Upon the beginning of my adventure as the Title III Project Director at Troy University Montgomery Campus, Dr. Sharon Everhardt had overseen the implementation of the project in the beginning months of the first grant year. Due to budget revisions needing to be completed, much of the work was put on hold, as well as waiting for the arrival of the new Title III Project Director. Overall, we made great progress in the first year of the grant. There were some challenges along the way but we were able to find solutions to keep us on track for success. I am looking forward to all that is to come with the Title III Project and the positive impacts that this project will have on Troy University.

Successes:

- 1. Renovations began in early 2021 on the 3rd floor of Rosa Parks Museum and by Summer of 2021, the walls were painted and new carpet installed.
- 2. The Title III Project Director (Bre Gentry-began March 8, 2021) and the Title III Project Coordinator (Danyal Jones-began April 1, 2021) were hired in Spring 2021.
- 3. The Title III Project Manual was developed and implemented to allow for success with managing the project.
- 4. A part-time Student Intervention Coach was hired in Summer 2021.
- 5. Budget revisions were completed and approved by the U.S. Department of Education.
- 6. The Center for Student Success advisors and retention personnel attended the NACADA Virtual Regional Conference in Spring 2021.
- 7. The five Title III Grant Committees were established in May 2021 to aid in the success of the project. (Grant Planning Committee, Advising Committee, Care Teams Committee, Financial Literacy Advisory Committee, and the Workforce Development Committee)
- 8. Two NACADA Consultants virtually evaluated advising at Troy University.
- 9. Mrs. Kay Floyd completed the first external evaluation of the Title III Project.

Challenges:

- 1. Longer lead times on many orders including technology (computers and laptops), workstation pieces, and contracting work. This has pushed our completion time back for moving the CSS staff to the new CSS space.
- 2. There was difficulty obtaining all paperwork needed from Office of Sponsored Programs to have the Title III Project Director changed from Dr. Sharon Everhardt to Mrs. Bre Gentry.
- 3. The newly hired part-time Student Intervention Coach resigned from her position. This caused us to be without a mental health counselor and re-post the position for a new hire.
- 4. The Title III Project Director found a large discrepancy in the budget for personnel benefits. It showed a shortage every year of the grant. This was resolved by modifying the budget.
- 5. The Troy Purchasing Department required the Title III Project to be bid for the contracting work. This caused a delay in obtaining contractors and beginning work. A few months later, the Title III Project Director was notified that there was a mistake and this project did not have to be bid out. This caused loss of funds in advertising and loss of time to complete renovations.
- 6. Due to the bidding process and obtaining updated quotes, the costs of renovation work was higher than originally budgeted.
- 7. Due to the small amount of work needed in the renovated area, it was difficult to find contractors.

The Troy University Title III Project was given five recommendations from Kay Floyd Consulting Group through the external evaluation report.

- 1. Develop a plan to promote the Center for Student Success.
- 2. Design/administer a Center for Student Success satisfaction survey and analyze data/usage.
- 3. Communicate project information, available resources, and successes.
- 4. Monitor implementation of NACADA Report Recommendations.
- 5. Build capacity for successful project management.

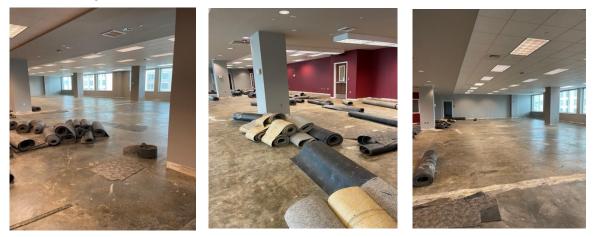
