

My Christmas Memories

Christmas 1898 "We were too poor for our father and mother to buy us anything to put in our stockings - That year we made 12 Bales of Cotton but Cotton had then years for 24¢ Cents per pound or 12.50 for a 500# Bale of Cotton - The total from all our Noo about \$150 or Cotton had as the lot to sell - But the children hang up our stockings before the night to bed - So when we got up Christmas morning the night to our stockings and found holes made made in them - Our Sisters - after the night to bed - had made the holes from sugar cans & cups - The pulled pulled pulled it till it was so tough they could not pull it more - They then laid it out on the table - and when it became hard - They cut it up in small pieces and put it in each of our stockings - It was so good - I never had a Christmas Cup since and this never forget the kind deed of my dear Sisters
