got to go out for a bit
Rearide to morrow the Div
will all haft to be out. So I
hope to see all of the Boys



I know in the Div same thing
and Gen. John J. P. I never have
seen the Big Gen. I have all
of the time wanted to see him
so I guess I will get to see
him now, hope so, any
well I have less hope each
day of going out of this
Mud I am just about to get
~~discouraged~~ with this thing
discouraged as I think this is the last
Div for I never see any thing of
it in any of the Papers and I see
all of the Rest Well I think we
will follow the AEF home at
that I sent you a Paper with
the no. that went home last
week hope you will get
it all o.k. I am sending you
some of the french money
